

Wednesday July the 28th the 1847
the first part light winds
from ESE on different tacks
saw grasshoppers and hiders saw
two sails at sunset took in
sail middle a fresh breeze heading
SE by S by the wind at daylight
made sail better the same so ends
Lat by Obs 36° 10' Lon by the 46° 25'

Thursday July the 29th the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from
E by N heading SE by S saw breeches
run for them did not see them again
at sunset took in sail the middle
and latter the same at daylight
made sail the watches imploded in
noting runs on different tacks so ends
Lat by Obs 35° 58' Lon by the 46° 28'

Friday July the 30th the 1847
the first part moderate winds
from from E heading SE by S at 1 PM
tacked ship at sunset took in sail
the middle the same at daylight made
sail had some rain wind hauled to the
E by E tacked to the NE the watches
imploded in main spinnaker so ends
Lat by Obs 35° 52' Lon by the 46° 28'

Saturday July the 31st the 1847
the first part moderate winds
from the ESE heading NE at 5 PM
tacked at sunset put one reef in
the topsails the middle and latter
the same so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 38' Lon by the 46° 14'

Sunday August the 1st the 1847
the first part light winds from ESE
heading SE at sunset took in sail
middle squalls at 11 AM wore ship at day
light made sail latter strong winds heading
NE by the wind at 9 AM took in the top
sail so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 02' N Lon by the 46° 08' W

Monday August the 2nd the 1847
the first part strong winds from ESE
heading NE by the wind at sunset took
in sail the same at daylight made sail
at 9 AM set the main topgallant sail the
watches imploded in bracing out water so ends
Lat by Obs 37° 20' N Lon by the 45° 20' W

Tuesday August the 3rd the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from ESE
heading NE at 1 PM tacked at sunset
took two reef in the topsails the middle
the same at daylight made sail at 6 AM
tacked ship latter moderate winds so ends
Lat by Obs 38° 40' N Lon by the 45° 16' W

Wednesday August the 4th the 1847
the first part light winds from E
heading SE at sunset put one reef
in the topsails the middle the same
at daylight made sail at 6 AM tacked
ship latter a fresh breeze from
SE by S heading SE by S the
watches imploded in flogging the over
board boat so ends this day
Lat by Obs 37° 05' N Lon by the

Thursday August the 5th the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from
SE by S heading SE by S at 6 AM
tacked at sunset put one reef in the
the topsails the middle and latter the
same at daylight made sail at 6 AM
tacked ship the watches imploded in flogging
the boat so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 38' N Lon by the 45° 19'

Friday August the 6th the 1847
the first part light winds from ESE
heading SE at 5 PM tacked at sun
set took in sail the middle the same
at daylight made sail at 7 AM lashed the
sail from E heading SE by S the watches
imploded in flogging the overhead boat
so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 36' N Lon by the 44° 53'
