

Sunday August the 15th the 1847
the first part light winds from
South steering E at sunset put
up reef in the topsails the middle
the rowind from S.W. steering S by E
at daylight made sail saw ~~the~~
big sails so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 47' Lon by Ch 40° 00'

Monday August the 16th the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from
S.W. steering E by S at 3 P.M. luffed
to the wind to the southward at
sunset took in sail and wore ship
the middle and better the same
on different tacks saw several sails
steering to the Eastward so ends
Lat by Obs 36° 31' Lon by Ch 39° 51'

Tuesday August the 17th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
S.W. and veering with squalls of rain
heading to the southward at 2 P.M.
took in main tops and all sail and
luffed reefed the topsails and
wore ship at sunset took in
sail middle moderate wind from
W by W heading S.W. at daylight
made sail saw one sail the watches
inploy in stripping blocks so ends
Lat by Obs 36° 13' Lon by Ch 39° 41'

Wednesday August the 18th the 1847
the first light winds and calm
heading S.W. at sunset took in
sail the middle the same at
daylight made sail better light
winds from S.W. heading S.W.
Lat by Obs 35° 50' Lon by Ch 39° 53'

Thursday August the 19th the 1847
the first light winds from S.W.
and veering steering S.W. at sun
set took in sail middle and luffed
wind W by E at daylight made sail steard
the Westward saw breaches run for them did
not see them again so ends Lat 35° 55' Lon 40° 16'

Friday August the 20th the 1847
the first light winds from S.W. heading
to the S.W. at sunset took in sail
middle the same at daylight made
sail better the wind from S.W.
heading S.W. saw grampuses the water
ch. inploy in plating sunset ends
Lat by Obs 35° 42' Lon by Ch 40° 41'

Saturday August the 21st the 1847
the first part light winds from
W by W heading S.W. with all sail set
at sunset took in sail the middle the
same at daylight made sail better
strong winds from S.W. on different
tacks saw grampuses so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 05' Lon by Ch 40° 40'

Sunday August the 22nd the 1847
the first strong winds from S.W.
heading to the S.W. at one 30 P.M.
tacked ship saw breaches run for
them did not see them again at
sunset took in sail the middle
the same at daylight made sail
heading to the W by the wind at 6 P.M.
tacked saw one sail so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 15' Lon by Ch 40° 37'

Monday August the 23rd the 1847
the first part strong winds from
the S.W. heading W by the wind at
sunset took in sail the same at day
light squally at 4 P.M. had heavy
rain at 10 P.M. cleared up so ends this
Lat by Obs 36° 15' Lon by Ch 40° 40'

Tuesday August the 24th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from
S.W. heading on different tacks at
sunset took in sail the middle nearly
calm at daylight calm made sail
better light winds from the S.W.
heading S.W. so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 25' Lon by Ch 40° 52'
