

Wednesday August the 25th the 1847
the first part strong winds from WSW
heading W saw two sails at sunset
took in sail the middle the
same at daylight squally
set gill and main sail up, sail in
night heading to the NW by the
wind so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 5' N Lon by Obs 40° 57'

Thursday August the 26th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
W heading to the NW at 11 AM
saw a bark to windward a whale
in worked up to her saw the boat
fast to the whale at sunset took
in sail the middle the same at 10 AM
more ships at daylight strong winds
from W heading NW made sail at
11 AM spoke the schooner John Adams
• 1/2 flb of oil were wind steward
at 11 AM hauled to the wind to
SE saw the bark cutting so ends

Friday August the 27th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
ENE at 10 AM spoke the ferry of
Provincetown cutting headed to
the E saw several sails at sun
set took in sail the middle
and latter the same at daylight
made sail heading W by the wind
the matches impleid in brace out
at sail saw two sails so ends
Lat by Obs 36° 5' N Lon by Obs 42° 11'

Saturday August the 28th the 1847
the first strong winds from ENE
heading W by the wind bent
the new gill main sail and main
topgallant sail saw a bark steering
to the Westward at sunset shortened
sail the middle and latter the same
at daylight made sail on different
tack sent down the fore top sail yard
and put on some bands wends
Lat by Obs 36° 5' N Lon by Obs 44° 25'

Sunday August the 29th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
ENE heading W at 11 AM sent
the fore top sail yard up and bent
the new top sail at 11 AM tacked
ships saw white water ran for it
it proved to be for wages at sunset
took in sail the middle the same
at daylight squally saw a brig to
the leeward and at the measure the
satter the same wends this day

Monday August the 30th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
ENE heading W at 11 AM sent
the top sail at sunset took in the fore
top sail and fore sail and sent down
the topgallant yards and took up the
boat and wore ship the middle and
latter the same so ends this day
Lat by Obs 37° 20' N Lon by Obs 46° 14'

Tuesday August the 31st the 1847
the first part strong winds from SE
heading ENE underfoot reefed main
top sail and fore sail at 11 AM wore
ship the middle the same at daylight
made some sail at 7 AM tacked wends
Lat by Obs 37° 14' N Lon by Obs 48° 57'

Wednesday Sept the 1st the 1847
the first part strong winds from
SE heading W at sunset took
in sail middle the same at daylight
strong winds and rainy wind from
NE and veering heading E at 11 AM
lighted up at 11 AM saw a school
of sperm whales going quick to the
windward saw two boats and chased
two whales saw them no more so ends
Lat by Obs 38° 45' N Lon by Obs 41° 50'
