

Thursday Sept the 2th the 1846
the first part strong winds from
SSE heading on different tack the
boats in chase of the whales at 2 PM
came on board headed to the Eastward
at sunset took in the fore top sail
and close reefed the main the mi
dle the same latter some seals of
rain saw cow fish so ends this day

Friday Sept the 3th the 1847
the first part strong gales from
SSE heading E at sunset waves
ship saw a sail to the windward
the middle and latter the same
the watches implaid in plating gaskets
so ends this day

Saturday Sept the 4th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
SE and thick and rainy heading
N W saw one sail at sunset took in
the fore top sail and fore sail the
middle and the main at daylight
made sail the wind from S Westward
E by compass one sail in sight so ends
Lat by Obs 36° 00' N Lon by Obs 41° 20'

Sunday Sept the 5th the 1847
the first moderate winds from W
heading E at 2 PM steered E by
at sunset took in sail and
steered ESE at 8 PM subject to the
wind to the northward at daylight
made sail nearly palm steered N 86° E
so ends Lat by Obs 36° 20' N Lon by Obs 42° 05'

Monday Sept the 6th the 1847
the first a light breeze from the Westward
steering N E saw white water in front
did see it again at sunset took in
sail the middle the same at daylight
made sail at 8 AM saw sperm whale
also board the the boats went
along side of a whale and used at
11:30 AM came on board and steered
on after the whales so ends
Lat by Obs 36° 25' N Lon by Obs 40° 55'

Tuesday Sept the 7th the 1847
the first part a fine breeze from SE
heading to the Eastward at 10 AM
board and struck ~~the~~ top of boat down
from one and killed the other at 6 PM
took the whale along side and broke
out the plubber room and got up
the tails and set the watch the
middle a strong breeze from SSE
at daylight commenced cutting at
9 AM got the looks in at 12 finish
the heave so ends this day
Lat by Obs 37° 00'

Wednesday Sept the 8th the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from
SSE heading S W all hands implaid
in clearing away the head at 5:50
AM commenced boiling and set the
watch the middle the same at 7 AM
wove ship one sail in sight at 10:50
AM had a squall of rain cooled down
the works at 11:30 AM lit up started
the fire again so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 51' N Lon by Obs 42° 50'

Thursday Sept the 9th the 1847
the first strong winds from SSE heading
N E all hands implaid in boiling
the middle rainy put out the fire
at daylight held up raining went
to boiling at 10 AM finished boiling
one sail in sight so ends

Friday Sept the 10th the 1847
the first part strong gales and from
SE and raged took in the fore top sail
and fore sail took up the boats the mid
dle very rainy latter strong gales at 11 AM
wove ship headed N E so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 16' N Lon by Obs 43° 56'
