

Saturday Sept the 11th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
E & E heading NE at 11 am set the
foremast the middle moderate and
set the gill and mainsail and turn
one reef out of the topsails at day
light made well sail heading E by N the
watch employed in stowing down the oil
so ends Lat by Obs 35° 47' N

Sunday Sept the 12th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
S & E heading E & E took in the main
top sail and trail saw two sails middle
moderate winds and thick weather
at daylight set the main top sail and trail
latter strong winds from S & E with
heavy rain took in sail to two reefs top
sails so ends this day

Monday Sept the 13th the 1847
the first strong winds from S & E with
rain heading E & E at 11 am took in the
fore top sail at 3 1/2 pm set it again
the middle the wind from S & E set the
main sail at daylight turned one reef out
of the topsails and set the gill at 11 30 am
turned the reefs out of the topsails so ends
Lat by Obs 37° 40' N Lon by Ch 41° 41'

Tuesday Sept the 14th the 1847
the first part a strong breeze from S & E heading
E & E at 4 pm saw black fish heard and chas
ed could not get up to them as came on
board headed to the S & W saw one sail the
middle a fine breeze and clear weather latter
the same at 7 am tacked the watch employed
in bending the new top sail so ends this day
Lat by Obs 37° 55' N Lon by Ch 41° 07' W

Wednesday Sept the 15th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from the
S & E and veering heading to the southward
by the wind the middle and latter the
on different tacks so ends this day
Lat by Obs 37° 50' N Lon by Ch 40° 48'

Thursday Sept the 16th the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from E & E
heading S bent the new main top sail at
5 pm spoke the ship barrels of iron Bed
ford Capt Amherst six weeks out 100 bbls
of oil the Capt went on board at 8 returned
ed headed to the S & E middle the same at
4 30 am tacked latter the same so ends
Lat by Obs 37° 51' N Lon by Ch 40° 17' W

Friday Sept the 17th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from
E and veering heading S & E middle the
winds from S & E and veering heading to
the E by the wind latter the wind
from S & E with squalls of rain heading S & E
so ends

Saturday Sept the 18th the 1847
the first part strong winds from E & E
heading S & E at 4 pm put two reefs in the
topsails and took in gill and main sail
and reefed the top sail and wore ship
the middle the same at daylight set
the main sail latter squalls lost reefed
the top sail and took in the main sail so ends
Lat by Obs 37° 40' N Lon by Ch 39° 52' W

Sunday Sept the 19th the 1847
the first part strong winds from E & E
heading S set the main sail saw gunners
the middle the wind from the S & E steering
S by E at 7 am turned one reef out of the
main top sail the latter the same turned
one reef out of the fore top sail so ends
Lat by Obs 37° 49' N Lon by Ch 37° 54'

Monday Sept the 20th the 1847
the first part strong winds from S & W
steering E & S set the gill at 5 am took
it in again took in the main sail
and top sail took in the fore top sail and
lost reefed the main ship some heavy
squalls of rain steering E & S latter moder
ated made all hauling sail so ends
Lat by Obs 38° 20' N Lon by Ch 35° 08' W
