N.W. steering S. by E. saw several sails in sight
at sunset took in fore top sail and hauled
middle and latter nearly calm saw plenty
porpoises so ends this day

Friday Oct. the 1st the 1847
the first part light winds from N and
veering steering S. by E. saw several
sails cum up with the lubbers and veered
on the latter and set it up at S. by
Georges head bore N. by E. dis 15 miles
and the S. E. point of New bore S. by E.
took Charles Valentine to steer a boat in
the place of Manchester middle the same
latter a fine breeze from N. W. steering different
courses the watches imploy in brown out
water so ends this day

Saturday Oct. the 2nd the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from N. W. W.
steering different courses running down
the E. side of St. Pierre middle staid S. by
compass thick and rainy at daylight
sited S. by Michel bearing S. by E. dis 15
miles latter strong winds from N. W. steer-
ing S. E. so ends this day

Sunday Oct. the 3rd the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from the
N. steering S. by E. at 4 P.M. sited S. by
Marie at sunset took in sail the south
point bore S. by E. at 10 P.M. hauled to
the wind to the E. N. E. at daylight saw
saw a brig to the windward at 7 A.M. steard
S. E. latter strong winds and raged so ends

Monday Oct. the 4th the 1847
the first part strong winds from N. W.
steering S. E. at sunset took in the
fore top sail and close reefed the main
the middle the same at daylight set
the fore top sail at 10 A.M. turned out
the reef of the main top sail
so ends this day
Sat by the 35.000 Sun by the 23.000

Tuesday Oct. the 5th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
N. W. steering S. E. at sunset took in
the fore top sail and doubled reefed
the main and hauled to the wind
to the westward middle the same
at daylight set the fore top sail
latter squally winds all round the
the compass at 11.30 A.M. took in the
fore top sail so ends this day

Wednesday Oct. the 6th the 1847
the first part strong winds from
N. W. heading to the Westward close
reefed the main top sail and took
in fore sail and sent down the top
equalant yards set the fore spencer
and close reef top sail middle more
moderate set the fore sail at daylight
set the fore top sail latter light wind
all round the compass sent down the
fore sail to repair so ends this day
Sat by the 34.000 Sun by the 22.000

Thursday Oct. the 7th the 1847
the first part light winds from N. E.
steering S. E. at 5 P.M. bent the fore
sail the wind hauled to the N. W. with rain
took in the fore top sail and close reef
the main and wore ship to the N. W.
the middle the same at daylight set
the fore top sail and turned one reef out
of the main heading N. by N. by the wind
saw one sail the watches imploy in fit-
ing cutting blocks straps so ends this day
Sat by the 33.000 Sun by the 21.000

Friday Oct. the 8th the 1847
the first part light winds from N. W.
heading N. W. W. at sunset took in sail
middle and different tacks at daylight made
sail latter moderate winds from N. W. steer-
ing S. E. saw three sails the watches imploy
in stripping the cutting blocks so ends this day
Sat by the 33.000 Sun by the 20.000
