

Saturday Oct the 9th the 1847
the first part light winds from
SW heading SE at sunset took in
sail the middle the same at day-
light made sail took in the west
boat to mail at 10:30 AM put her
on the cranes a gain steard SE so ends
Sat by Obs 32° 34' N Lon by the 21° 49'

Sunday Oct the 10th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from
SW steering SE at sunset took in
sail the middle the same at daylight made
sail steard SE latter light winds from W
so ends Sat by Obs 31° 35' N Lon by the 20° 06'

Monday Oct the 11th the 1847
the first part moderate winds
from W steering SE at sunset took
in sail and luffed to the wind to the
southward the middle the same at
daylight made sail the hauls to the
steard SE the watches imployed in pain-
ting the west boat and knitting yarns
so ends Sat by Obs 31° 03' N Lon by the 19° 29'

Tuesday Oct the 12th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from
NE steering SE at sunset took in
sail middle the same at daylight
made sail latter moderate winds
from SE and good weather steering
SE by E the watches imployed in macin
spinnjarn so ends this day
Sat by Obs 29° 50' N Lon by the 18° 41' W

Wednesday Oct the 13th the 1847
the first part a fine breeze from NE
steering SE by E set up the fore stays
at sunset took in sail at daylight
saw the fall of Palma bearing SE by S
dis 40 miles made sail steard in for the
land the watches imployed in bravin
out water so ends this day

Thursday Oct the 14th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from
NE steering different courses saw the
fall of Palma bearing SE by S dis 40 miles
the middle the same steard SE at day-
light made sail latter nearly calm the wa-
tches imployed in strapping the upper blocks
to the cutting tackles so ends this day

Friday Oct the 15th the 1847
the first part nearly calm heading
SE at sunset took in the light sails
middle the same at daylight made sail
with a light breeze from NE heading SE
at 6:30 AM sight a school of sperm whales
board and struck one and killed him with
the iron and the others went to the wind
ward chased could not get up to them
again at 11:30 AM came on board so ends

Saturday Oct the 16th the 1847
the first part calm all hands imploy-
ed in cutting at 2 PM finished and
commenced clearing away the head at
sunset finished and set the walch and
went to boiling middle a moderate
breeze from from the SE heading SE by E
latter the same on different tacks
all hands imployed in boiling and
bravin out bread and flour so ends
this day of SE of Teneroff

Sunday Oct the 17th the 1847
the first part light winds from
SW heading SW saw grasshoppers
all hands imployed in boiling at
9 PM finished middle the same
steering SW by W latter light winds
all round the compass and cloudy
heading different courses so ends this day
the land in sight
