

Monday Oct the 18th the 1847
the first part light winds from
S E heading to the S W at 10pm
picked up a large stick of timber
40 feet long and 14 inch square saw
one sail at 4pm wore ship at
sunset took in sail the middle
the same at daylight made sail
latter moderate winds S E heading
S E employed in being out a topsail
yard so ends this day

Tuesday Oct the 19th the 1847
the first part light winds from
N E heading S E at sunset took
in sail and wore ship the ~~top~~
middle the same at daylight made
sail employed in making the top
sail yard at 10pm tacked ship
saw a ship standing to the south
so ends this day the land in sight

Wednesday Oct the 20th the 1847
the first part moderate winds
from N E heading to the S E at
sunset took in sail middle the same
at 10pm wore ship at daylight made
sail saw a ship the watcher employed
in ~~being~~ stowing down the oil so ends

Thursday Oct the 21st the 1847
the first part light winds from
N E and veering at sunset took in
sail the middle and latter light winds
the south at daylight made all sail on
different tacks so ends this day

Friday Oct the 22nd the 1847
the first part light winds from S S W
heading S E saw one sail at sunset
tacked ship and took in the light sails
Genereef being S by E 40 miles and
the nearly calm latter a fresh breeze from
S W and veering on different tacks so ends

Saturday Oct the 23rd the 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from S W
on different tacks bent the fore top galley
mainsail saw two sails at sunset took in
sail Genereef being S by E 40 miles
at 9pm wore ship to the W N W middle
the same at daylight made sail at 9pm
strong winds from S W and very rainy
doubled reef the topsails rainy
all the forenoon on different tacks
so ends this day and no whales

Sunday Oct the 24th the 1847
the first part squally the wind S W
and veering middle rainy latter the
same heading S W S W the wind from S
saw a brig steering to Westward so ends

Monday Oct the 25th the 1847
the first part strong winds from south
and squalls of rain heading W S W at
9pm took in the fore topsail and
lost reefed the main at 5pm took
in the foresail and lost reefed the
trysail the middle the same at daylight
set doubled reef topsails latter moderate
and thick so ends this day

Tuesday Oct the 26th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from
S W heading S E set mainsail and gill
at sunset took in sail and wore ship
middle the same at daylight made
sail latter calm washed the round
outside saw plenty of turtle so ends
Lat by Obs 27° 15' Lon by Ch 17° 06'

Wednesday Oct the 27th the 1847
the first part light winds from S W
heading N W E at sunset took in the top
galley and gill and tacked ship the
middle the same at daylight made sail
latter light winds from N heading W N W
saw the side of itero and homary and
Genereef saw grampuses so ends this day
and no whales
