

Thursday Oct. the 28th the 1847
the first part light winds from NW
heading NW at sunset took in sail
Ego burying W by W 40 miles the middle
the same at daylight made sail better
wind ESE heading N at 11 AM wore ship
pumped a cask of water and put in
but so ends this day the land in sight

Friday Oct. the 29th the 1847
the first part moderate winds from
ESE and thick smoky weather heading
SE saw white water off the lee bow
run for it did not see it more at sun
set took in sail the title of Gamary being
NNE 20 miles middle a fresh trades
on different tacks at daylight made sail
heading to the NW broke out the old main
topsail and went to work to repair it at
11 AM wore ship so ends this day

Saturday Oct. the 30th the 1847
the first part fresh trades heading
to the SE watches impleid in mending
the topsail saw three sails steering
to the westward at sunset took in
sail the middle the same at 11 PM
wore ship at daylight made sail on
different tacks saw two sails so ends

Sunday Oct. the 31st the 1847
the first part strong trades heading
to the ESE at sunset took in sail
and wore ship the middle the same on
different tacks at daylight made sail
steered SW by S so ends this day
Lat by Obs 26° 42' N Lon by Ch 16° 56'

Monday Nov. the 1st the 1847
the first part light trades at
sunset nearly calm took in sail
middle and better the same at
daylight made sail sent up the sail
yards and sent down the topsail mast
to repair so ends this day
Lat by Obs 26° 02' N Lon by Ch 17° 21'

Tuesday November the 2nd the 1847
the first part light winds and veering
steered SW by S caught two turtles at sun
set took in sail the middle and latter
the same at daylight made sail the
watches impleid in bracing out for water
picked up a ships head so ends this day
Lat by Obs 25° 36' N Lon by Ch 17° 57'

Wednesday November the 3rd the 1847
the first part light winds and calm
heading to the S by the watches impleid
in mending the old fore topsail at sun
set took in sail middle a fine breeze
ESE laid back through the night at
daylight made sail steered SW set
the fore topmast standing sail so ends
Lat by Obs 25° 13' N Lon by Ch

Thursday November the 4th the 1847
the first part light winds steering
SW bent the old fore topsail at
sunset took in sail nearly calm the
middle light winds from the East
on different tacks at daylight made
sail heading SE at 9 AM steered SW
thick weather with some small rain
steered the same so ends this day

Friday November the 5th the 1847
the first part moderate winds
from E and thick weather steering
SW at 1 PM luffed to the wind to
Northward saw one sail at sunset took
in sail the middle the same at day
light made sail steered SW latter
moderate winds from W & and cloudy
weather so ends this day
Lat by Obs 24° 24' N Lon by Ch 17° 58'

Saturday November the 6th the 1847
the first part moderate trades steering
SW at sunset took in sail the middle and
latter fresh trades steering the same
at daylight made sail saw five fakes
so ends Lat by Obs 22° 28' N Lon by Ch 18° 10'
