

Monday November the 15<sup>th</sup> the 1847  
the first part a fresh trade heading  
to the E & E saw sulper tuborn  
and killers at sunset took in sail  
the middle the same on different  
tacks at daylight made sail heading  
to the Eastward latter moderate  
the watches impleid in knapping yarns  
saw porpoises so ends this day  
Lat by Obs 17° 46' N Lon by Obs 18° 20'

Tuesday November the 16<sup>th</sup> the 1847  
the first part wind and thick weather  
heading to the Northward at sunset  
took in sail the middle and latter  
a fresh trade on different tacks  
at daylight made sail the watches  
impleid in main rope so ends this day  
Lat by Obs 17° 36' N Lon by Obs 18° 11' W

Wednesday November the 17<sup>th</sup> the 1847  
the first part moderate trade steering  
S W by S saw finbacks and porpoises at  
sunset took in sail and luffed to the  
Westward the middle on different  
tacks at daylight made sail heading  
to the Eastward at 8 AM steard S W by S  
latter strong trades so ends this day  
Lat by Obs 18° 29' N Lon by Obs 18° 2'

Thursday November the 18<sup>th</sup> the 1847  
the first part fresh trade steering  
S W by S saw plenty of albatross  
and birds at sunset took in sail and  
luffed to the wind to Northward  
the middle the same at daylight made  
sail the wind from the East head-  
ing to the Northward at 11 AM saw  
blackfish bands two boats and chased  
could not get fast at 8:30 AM came  
on board steard S W by compass  
thick cloudy weather so ends

Friday November the 19<sup>th</sup> the 1847  
the first part nearly calm heading to  
the Westward the watches impleid in fitting  
the futack boards and strapping blocks at  
sunset took in sail the middle light wind  
to from W N W heading to the S W latter  
the same steard S W the watches  
impleid in bravin out for winter  
so ends this day and no whales  
Lat by Obs 17° 50' N Lon by Obs 19° 50'

Saturday November the 20<sup>th</sup> the 1847  
the first part light winds from the W  
steering S W saw a sulper tuborn at  
sunset took in sail and luffed to the  
Eastward the middle the same at day  
light made sail wind light and veering  
heading to the Southward saw grandpawes so ends  
Lat by Obs 17° 41' N Lon by Obs

Sunday November the 21<sup>st</sup> the 1847  
the first part light winds from the  
E heading S E at sunset took in sail  
and luffed to the at daylight made sail strong  
trades at 8 AM steard S W saw some birds  
at 10 AM luffed to the to wind to the  
Eastward so ends this day  
Lat by Obs 16° 45' N Lon by Obs 18° 33'

Monday November the 22<sup>nd</sup> the 1847  
the first part strong trades from S E  
heading to the Eastward at 4 PM  
wore ship steard W N W at sunset  
took in sail and luffed to the wind to  
the Northward middle the wind the  
same at 10 PM wore ship at daylight  
made sail heading to the Eastward at  
8 AM wore ship set the main topgallant  
sail at 11 AM steard S W so ends
