

Tuesday November the 23th the 1847
the first part fresh trades steering S.W.
by compass the watches implaid in setting
up the main topmast backstays and
the fore topmast fore and aft stays
at sunset took in sail headed to the
14th W the middle and latter the
wind the same at 3 AM wore ship
at daylight made sail on different
tacks the watches implaid in drawing and
knoting yarns ends this day
Lat by Obs 16° 15' Lon by Ch 11° 04'

Wednesday November the 24th the 1847
the first part strong trades steering
N.W. saw black fish found and struck
one and brand came on board at
sunset took in sail headed to the
14th W middle the same at daylight
made sail at 8 AM steard S.W. saw
a bark standing to the south so ends
Lat by Obs 17° 01' Lon by Ch 21° 00'

Thursday November the 25th the 1847
the first part strong trades steering
W.N.W. set up the the sail stays and
fore topmast stay at sunset shortened
sail middle the same at daylight
made sail saw two sails at 8 AM
saw small island bearing W.N.W.
latter the same steering in for
the land so ends this day

Friday November the 25th
the first part pleasant trades
steering different course down the
land run low ~~the~~ to the barby rock
and hauld off to the S.W. by W the
watches implaid in main rope at
sunset took in sail middle steard
the same at 9 AM saw St. Nicolas
and luffed S.W. at daylight made
sail steard the same at 9 AM
sited the Isle of St. Vincent
and St. Antony so ends

Saturday November the 27th 1847
the first part strong trades steering
N.W. by W at sunset took in sail luffed
to the north middle the same at day
made sail steard W.N.W. so ends this day
Lat by Obs 17° 52' Lon by Ch 25° 49'

Sunday November the 28th
the first part strong trades and veered
steard S.W. by W at sunset took in sail
the middle the same at 11 AM luffed
to the wind to the S.E. and hauld back
the fore topsail at daylight braced
forward the head yards and furlled one
reef out of the top sails at 4 AM steard
S.W. so ends this day and no whales
Lat by Obs 16° 38' Lon by Ch 26° 56'

Monday November the 29th the 1847
the first part strong trades and
veered steard S.W. by compass at sun
set took in sail and luffed to S.E.
middle the same at daylight made
sail at 8 AM steard W saw two sails
standing to the south so ends this day
Lat by Obs 15° 36' Lon by Ch 27° 00'

Tuesday November the 30th the 1847
the first part strong trades heading
to the southward by the wind at 5 PM
wore ship at sunset took in sail and
hauld the fore topsail aback at 5 PM
braced forward the middle the same at day
light made sail latter light winds and
cloudy heading to the south so ends
Lat by Obs 15° 16' Lon by Ch 27° 16'

Wednesday December the 1st the 1847
the first part moderate trades steering
S by W at sunset took in sail and luffed to
the wind the middle wind S.E. at 12 PM
wore ship at daylight made sail headed
S by the wind latter a fine breeze and
good weather the watches implaid in
weaving a mat and other things to
numerous to mention so ends this day
Lat by Obs 14° 28' Lon by Ch 27° 05'
