

Sunday December the 12th 1847
the first part fresh trades steering
W the middle and latter the same
saw a bark a whaleman stand in
to the W by the wind so ends this day
Lat by Obs 12° 12' N Lon by Obs 59° 50'

Monday December the 13th
the first part strong trades ~~from~~
steering W by compass at sunset
took in sail and luffed to the W
by the wind through the night
on different tacks at day light
made sail heading to the E by
the wind at 8 AM steered W so ends
Lat by Obs 12° 18' N Lon by Obs 55° 00'

Tuesday December the 14th 1847
the first strong trades steering
W by W at 3 PM luffed to the wind
to the W had some rain took in
sail the middle and latter strong
winds under close reef top sails and
foresail heading W by the wind
so ends Lat by Obs 15° 16' N Lon by Obs 55° 50'

Wednesday December the 15th 1847
the first strong winds from ENE
heading to the N at sunset took
fore top sail and foresail the middle
and latter heavy squalls under
close reefed top sail so ends this day
Lat by Obs 14° 15' N Lon by Obs 55° 45'

Thursday December the 16th 1847
the first part strong gales
heading W by the wind under
a close reefed main top sail the
middle the same at daylight set the
fore sail at 11 AM steered W by W
at 8 AM set the fore top sail close
reef turned one reef out the main
top sail so ends this day
Lat by Obs 15° 18' N Lon by Obs 54° 40'

Friday December the 17th the 1847
the first part strong trades and
very ragged steering W by W under
short sail the middle and latter
the same steering W so ends this day
Lat by Obs 15° 23' N Lon by Obs 54° 25'

Saturday December the 18th 1847
the first part strong winds and
ragged steering W at sunset took in
the fore top sail and close reefed the
main at 1 PM luffed to the wind at
daylight made sail at 6:50 AM sailed
Dominico stood in for the land saw
several sails so ends this day beating
up into Prince Rupert's Bay

Sunday December the 19th 1847
the first part a moderate breeze
worn up in to the Bay at 2 PM
came to anchor the capt went on
shore broke out and fitted a raft
of cask for water through the night
moderate at 8 AM the watch went
on shore on liberty at 12 o'clock came
on board so ends this day

Monday December the 20th 1847
the first part a fresh breeze from
Eastward at 1 PM the other watch
went on shore at sunset came off
through the night moderate at day
light rafted the cask at 11 AM went
on shore to get water at 9 came on
board with the raft and took it in
and stowed it away so ends this day

Tuesday December the 21st 1847
the first part strong trades at
1 PM went on shore to fit another
raft at 5:30 PM took it on board
through the night moderate three men
deserted one took a boat but belonged
on shore only in the evening the other
to prevent on plank in the night the
latter got a raft of water so ends
