

Tuesday January the 25th the 1848
the first part light winds from
the Northward off to the whale
at 4:30 P.m. took the whale along
side got dinner and commenced
cutting at 5 P.m. finished cutting
and cleared up and got supper
and set the watch and commenced
boiling the middle moderate
light gale through the night
at daylight braced forward heded
to the Southward by the wind
winds from the Eastward saw
hump backs tacked again before
boat at 10 a.m. the rest employed
in boiling could not get past
so ends this day in Maoner Passage

Wednesday January the 26th the 1848
the first gale at 4:30 a.m.
came on board took a breeze
from the N.E. steered S.E. saw
humpbacks board one boat did
not get past came on board
headed W.W. spoke the Brig
Samuel Cook Cook master at
sunset took in sail at 8 P.m.
finished boiling at supper made
sail headed to the S.E. saw several
sails saw humpbacks so ends this day

Thursday January the 27th the 1848
the first part strong winds
from the Northward steered
to the S.E. at sunset took in sail
headed to the Eastward middle
and latter the same at daylight
made sail headed to the Eastward
so ends this day in Maoner Passage

Friday January the 28th the 1848
the first part strong winds from
the North on different tacks at sun
set took in sail the middle and
latter the same at daylight made sail
on different tacks at 10 a.m. the light breeze for
humpbacks did not get past came on board

Saturday January the 29th the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze from
the N heading W.W. at 3 P.m. tacked
ships several sails in sight at 5:30 a.m.
tacked at sunset took in sail the
middle light winds from N.E. on
different tacks at daylight made sail
heading to the Eastward latter calm
employed in stowing down the oil saw
three sails so ends this day Maoner Passage

Sunday January the 30th the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze from
the N on different tacks finished stowing
the oil at sunset took in sail at 10 a.m.
in sight middle on different tacks
at daylight made sail heading to the
E by the wind at 4 a.m. tacked ships
steered W.W. at 11 a.m. steered W so ends

Monday January the 31st the 1848
the first part moderate winds
from N.W. and veering steering
W.W. at 3 P.m. heded to the N.W.
by the wind at 5:30 P.m. set the
stake of the Darrington bearing
N.W. by W dis 20 miles at sunset
took in sail and tacked ship middle
on different at daylight made sail
heading to the E at 6:30 a.m. tacked ship
at 9 a.m. tacked again off Savna so ends

Tuesday February the 1st the 1848
the first part strong winds from
N.W. heading E by the wind at
sunset took in sail tacked ship
the S.W. Point bearing E by S 20
miles middle on different tacks at
daylight made sail run down for
maoner at 10:30 a.m. went on shore
for wood at 12 came off with
a lark so ends off sand on
