

Wednesday February the 2th the 1848
the first part moderate wind
from the East off and on
to mooner two boats cruised on
shore wooden got off five load
at sunset took in sail and
headed to the Southward
the middle the same at day
light made sail at 7 AM saw
sperm whales off the weather bow
going, group to the windward did
not lose on different tacks winds
Portoreco bearing 10° E 30 miles

Thursday February the 3th the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze from
the East on different tacks at 5 PM
saw breeches off the lee bow run for
them did not see them again at
at sunset took in sail heading 10° N E
by the wind the middle the same
on different tacks at daylight made
sail at 7 AM tacked ship to the N E
latter strong winds from N E the
watches involved in bracing out
the runs and staying away now
so ends this day off the 5° N point
of Portoreco

Friday February the 4th the 1848
the first part a brisk breeze from
E N E at 1 PM tacked ship to the
South the watches involved
in bracing out the main halchway
broke out the old桁 rail and
stole away some wood at sunset
tacked and took in sail the mid
dle the wind the same on different
tacks at daylight made sail head
ing to the Southward at 7 AM tacked
saw two sails the watches involved
in miking up the old桁 rail
at 1 PM steered W N W so ends

Saturday February the 5th the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze from E
steering off W saw breeches run for them
found them to be hump backs wore
ship to the Southward at sunset
took in sail the middle on different
tacks at daylight made sail headed
to the Northward at 11 AM steered
W N W so ends this day

Sunday February the 6th the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze from
S steering to the Westward at 5 PM
the capt went on shore to Mooner
without a goat at dusk came off
did not get a goat took in sail headed
to the Southward middle wind the same
at 8 AM wore ship at daylight made
sail at 7 AM tacked ship saw one sail
so ends this day

Monday February the 7th the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze from E
steering W by N at 4 PM steered W N W
at sunset took in sail and headed to
the the wind to the Southward
middle on different tacks at daylight
made sail heading to the N E by the
wind at 8 AM steered W by N saw
one sail the watches involved in
wearing mats and other things
to numerous to mention so ends this day

Tuesday February the 8th the 1848
the first strong trades and rugged
steering W by N found one the gill
guies stranded put in a strand and
set it up and set up bowsprit
bowed martail guise and gill stay
at sunset took in sail and steered
W by N at daylight made sail saw the
beard saw two sails painted the Starboard
boat so ends this day
