

Wednesday February the 9th the 1848
the first part fresh breezes
steering W by S at 4 PM saw
alluvial shoring i' the W by S
at sunset shortened sail
middle wind the same at 12 PM luffed
to the wind on different tacks at
daylight made sail with a strong
breeze heading to the Northward
latter nearly calm the watches im-
ployed in weering males saw a bark
in shore saw a steamer winds

Thursday February the 10th the 1848
the first part nearly calm at
sunset took in sail the middle
and latter wind nearly the same
at daylight made all sail headed
to the Northward the Parker Cook
in sight so ends this day

Friday February the 11th the 1848
the first part light winds from
the W heading to the Northward
at 5 PM tacked at sunset took
in sail off the white cleft the
middle the same at daylight made
sail on different tacks the watches
employed in bracing water so ends

Saturday February the 12th the 1848
the first part took a strong wind
from E on different tacks the
watches employed in in main rope
at 2 PM reefed the topsails at
sunset took in sail heading to
Southward middle made at on
different tacks at daylight up off
the full cape made sail run for
the white cleft latter nearly
calm the watches employed fitting
preventer girt to the gill boom
so ends this day in dumb bay

Sunday February the 13th the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze from
E steering W by S at 4 PM the from
the westward headed to the Southward
at sunset took in sail middle the
same on different tacks at daylight
made sail light wind all round
the compass latter the same the
bark in sight so ends in dumb bay

Monday February the 14th the 1848
the first part light winds from
from SE and veering heading E by E
at 3 PM tacked at 5 PM saw a
shoal of blackfish board two boats
could not get past at dark came
on board took in sail heading E by E
the wind the middle the same
on different tacks at daylight made
sail heading to the E by E the wind
latter the same employed in fitting
on preventer girt to the gill boom
and set them up and some other
head rigging so ends this day dumb bay

Tuesday February the 15th the 1848
the first part light winds from the
Eastward steering in for the cleft at
1 PM saw a shoal of blackfish board
could not get up to them at 2 PM
came on board the wind baffin headed
to the westward at 5 PM took a
squal from the S doubled reefed the
topsails got a compass the middle and
latter the wind veering all round the
compass at daylight made sail on different
tacks employed in main bowsprit so ends
this day in dumb bay

Wednesday February the 16th the 1848
the first part light winds from E
and veering on different tacks at 5 PM
spoke the Parker Cook the Capt. was
on board at 9 PM made middle land
latter the same at daylight made
sail on different tacks so ends
