

Friday, February the 25th the 1848
the first part strong trades doubled
reefed the topsails on different
tacks, heaving to windward and
out winded all the others at sunset
reefed the topsail the middle the
same on different tacks at daylight
quite moderate mod all sail heaving
to the northward at 9 am tacked at
10 am strong trades took in main top
galantines at 11 doubled reefed the
the topsails and took in the mainsail
on different tacks being up to and on
the bark and schooner in sight to the
leeward so ends this day

Saturday February the 26th the 1872
the first part strong trades on different
tracks at 1 Pm took in gale at 2.30 Pm
came to anchor to bottomless core
rove a new fore base the middle the
same at sunrise took the anchor and
and run down for the deep with a light
bree from the Eastward at 1 Pm took
strong trades heading to the South
so ends this day in same way

Sunday February the 27th the 1848
the first part strong winds E & S
on different tracks saw a schooner
beating up to windward the Bark
P Cook and Edwin went in to
anchor at 5.15.0 PM spoke the Rhine
the Capt came on board at 9.00 the
Capt went home through the night
on different tracks at day light made
sail beat up into Conk's cove at 8.15.0 AM
came to anchor latter strong winds
so ends this day in Conk's Cove

Monday February the 25th the 1843
the first part strong trades at 1 P.M. the
Rhine came to anchor through the night
wind the same latter rather more mor-
derate when the main topsail failed
to repair a boat boarded us from the shore
with yams traded Bread for two barrels
of yams traded 250 lbs of bread with
the Cook for Molasses &c ends.

Tuesday March the first four strong
trades lying to anchor in port in in
mending the topsails at 4 PM finish
and bent up the middle masts
at daylight got underway the other
three vessels in company light wind
from the Eastward sailed to the
Westward latter light wind from
W. heading to the Southward so ends

Wednesday March the 1st the 1848
 the first part strong trader heading
 I saw three sails runy to Westward
 at 10 am took in fore topgallantail
 at 3 pm tacked at sunset took in
 sail Altergala huring S E by E the
 middle the same on different tack at
 daylight made sail heading to the
 Southward at 4 pm tacked ship at
 8 pm steard N by W saw blackfish
 going to windward did not lose scends

Thursday March the 2^d of the 1848
the first part fresh trade steering
to the Westward at 8 Pm heeled to
the wind to the Southward at 4 Pm
tacked the three whales in sight
at sunset, tacked and took in sail
the ship being ~~10~~ 10 miles the
middle the same or different tack
at daylight moderate made all sail heading
to the Southward at 10 run off to the
W at 8 am heeled to the wind to the
at 9 Pm took in squibs top gallant
and mainsail at 10 tacked doubled reefed
the the topsails 10 ends this day
