

Friday March the 3rd the 1848
the first part strong trades on
different tacks took in the gill
and reefed the topsail at sunset
the gill cape bore S E 15 miles
middle and latter the same at
daylight set the fore sail strong
winds at 10 am came to anchor
in bottomless cove sent down the
main yard and filed up the crucks
and put some furling under the
bands and set up the fore topmast
stays so ends this day

Saturday March the 4th the 1848
the first strong trades sent up the
main yard and shortened the fore
stay and set it up and set up
gill stay and and topgalant say
the Rhine and P Cook in sight
under short sail the middle
moderate at daylight took the
anchor and stood to the westward
latter strong trades so ends

Sunday March the 5th the 1848
the first part strong trades on
different tacks working up to Cook
Cove at 6 am came to anchor the
Rhine in company and the schooner
through the night quite moderate
at sunrise breezed up strong at
8 am the P Cook came to anchor
so ends this day in Cook Cove

Monday March the 6th the 1848
the first part strong trades lying
to anchor middle and latter the
same came up with the main
topmast rigging and backstays
and and lighted it up to put
one of the arms in its place the
capt on board the Rhine so ends

Tuesday March the 7th the 1848
the first part fresh trades employ
in setting up the topmast and bar
rigging the Brig Samuels Cook came in
to anchor the middle moderate at
daylight got under way and stood to
the Westward the other vessels in com
pany at 9 am hauled to the wind to
the S latter strong trades took in main
topgalant sail and reefed the fore top
sail so ends this day in Sam's Bay

Wednesday March the 8th the 1848
the first strong trades heading to
the South at 10 am tacked and
reefed the main topsail at 4 pm
took in gill and main sail and steard
N W at sunset headed to the S
the middle moderate at daylight
made sail heading to the S by the
wind at 10 am tacked latter strong trades
heading to S imploding in bracing out
water at 11 30 am tacked parted the
gill guies so ends this day in Sam's Bay

Thursday March the 9th the 1848
the first part strong trades heading
to the S the Rhine went in to
anchor at 10 30 am left off to the
W the watches imploy in drawing
and knotting yards at sunset took
in sail and luffed to the wind to the
Southward through the night the
wind the same on different tacks
at daylight made some sail steard
W by compass the watches imploy
in knotting yards so ends this day

Friday March the 10th the 1848
the first part strong trades and
rugged steering W the watches im
ploy in main gill rope for gill guies
at sunset shortened sail the middle
luff aback at daylight made sail steard
W imploy in fitting gill guies so ends
