

Saturday March the 11th the 1848
the first part fresh trades steering
W by E saw a steamer bound to
windward put on the gill quies
and set them up saw a brig steering
to the westward at 6 PM took
the wind from the N W braced
up heading W by W at sunset took
in sail the S W Point of St. Domingo
bearing N W by N 15 miles
middle light wind steering N W at
daylight saw the Isle d'Orvèze had
a squall of rain at sunrise made sail
latter calm saw three sails the watches
employed in scraping topmasts and
slushing and cleaning tools so ends

Sunday March the 12th the 1848
the first part calm at 5 PM
took the trades heading to the N
at sunset took in sail braced
the middle strong winds on different
tacks at daylight moderate made
all sail heading to the Westward
saw two sails so ends off the W end of St. Domingo

Monday March the 13th the 1848
the first part to a moderate breeze
from the N E heading to the N W
at 1:30 PM took up sunset shortened
sail the first of the night good weather
on different tacks at 9 AM had a heavy
squall of rain at daylight nearly calm
made all sail headed to the Northward
by the wind a ship and a bark in sight
so ends this day off the west end of St. Domingo

Tuesday March the 14th the 1848
the first part light winds from E N E
heading N at sunset shortened sail
middle the same on different tacks
at daylight made sail heading E N E
latter nearly calm the watches emp-
loyed in strapping blocks and surging
fore topmast back stays so ends this
day off the West End of St. Domingo

Wednesday March the 15th the 1848
the first part light winds from
the North heading to the Eastward
capt two dolphins sited nothing of
the whale kind at sunset the wind
brought to the N E took ship shortened
sail latter middle strong winds
and roused at daylight set gill and
mainsail latter the same at
10 AM wore ship took in gill and
mainsail saw two sails so ends this day

Thursday March the 16th the 1848
the first part strong gales from the
N heading to the Eastward at sunset
lost sight the topsails the middle
the same at 12 PM wore ship latter to
at 7 PM wore ship saw the Isle of Gonavi
bearing E by S 20 miles at 11 PM staid
so ends this day

Friday March the 17th the 1848
the first part strong gales and
and roused steering S at 10 PM luffed
to the wind to the N W the middle
the same at daylight some rain at
8 PM wore ship to the E at 10 AM set
the fore sail sited nothing so ends

Saturday March the 18th the 1848
the first part strong gales from N E
staid by E saw the land at 4 PM
luffed to the wind to the N W the
the middle the same at daylight more
severe guide sail heading to E S E at
8 PM staid saw one sail at 11 AM
luffed to the wind to the Eastward
at 12 O'clock wore ship so ends

Sunday March the 19th the 1848
the first part light winds from the
N heading W by W at sunset took in
sail cape Verde bore bearing N E 15
45 miles the middle the same at day-
light made sail heading to the
N W at 7:30 AM staid W at 8 saw
a large sperm whale at 9 lound
