

Tuesday April the 11<sup>th</sup> the 1848  
the first part light winds from  
W by W heading S by W one sail in sight  
the watches employed in running and  
leathering the boat stow and set it  
up at 5 PM picked up article of  
mahogany at sunset reported said  
middle the same at daylight made  
sail the wind from W by W at 6 PM  
hauled to the wind to E latter the  
same got up gill quies and lower part  
sounded so ends off St Domingo

Wednesday April the 12<sup>th</sup> the 1848  
the first part fresh breeze from the  
W steering S by S at 5 PM went on  
shore to Gonave for wood at dusk  
came on board with a boat load  
shortened sail headed to the N by E the  
middle the same on different tack at  
daylight made sail heading S by S  
by the wind at 1 PM went on  
shore for wood so ends this day  
off and on to Gonave

Thursday April the 13<sup>th</sup> the 1848  
the first part moderate winds  
from the NE at 12 PM the the  
boat came off with wood took it  
on board and headed to the N by W  
at sunset shortened sail, cape, Nicks  
Note bearing N by S 30 miles through  
the night headed N at daylight  
made sail latter a strong wind  
from E by E heading N several sails  
in sight so ends this day

Friday April the 14<sup>th</sup> the 1848  
the first part fresh winds from  
E by E heading to the N by E  
the wind saw several sails at  
8 PM steering N by W the middle the  
same at daylight saw several sails  
steering N by W by S and different courses  
saw several keys so ends this day  
Lat by Obs 22° 15' 58"

Saturday April the 15<sup>th</sup> the 1848  
the first part light winds from the  
Eastward at 2 PM saw Fortune &  
Isle steered N by W one bark and two  
Brijs and a schooner in sight out saild  
all of them bent the new main top  
sail and fore sail at sunset Fortune Isle  
bore S by E 10 miles at 8 PM steered  
N by W middle the same at 11 PM  
steered N by W saw two sails latter light  
winds from S by S so ends this day  
Lat by Obs 24° 16' 58" Lon by Ch 73° 52'

Sunday April the 16<sup>th</sup> the 1848  
the first part light winds from S by  
steering N by W by compass middle the  
the same at daylight the wind hauled  
to the N by W latter the same so ends  
Lat by Obs 26° 14' 58" Lon by Ch 73° 55'

Monday April the 17<sup>th</sup> the 1848  
the first part fresh winds from N by  
steered N by W at 3 PM the wind  
hauled to the N by W and thick cloudy  
weather took in topgallant sails and doul-  
led reefed the fore topsail and singled  
the main heading N by the wind at  
4 PM the wind hauled to the N by W and  
breasted on took in gill and main sail  
at 5 PM the wind N and clear away  
ship to the N by W at daylight took  
in the gill and main sail latter  
the wind N by E heading N by W  
had a squall took in gill and  
main sail so ends this day  
Lat by Obs 26° 25' 58" Lon 74° 58'

Tuesday April the 18<sup>th</sup> the 1848  
the first part strong winds from  
N by E and veering to N by E and reeved  
heading to the westward saw a ship  
steering S by W at 2 PM set the main  
sail middle moderate some set the  
gill and turne one reef out of the  
main topsail steering N by W by N at  
daylight turne the reefs out of the top  
sails and set main topgallant sail saw two sails  
so ends Lat 27° 05' 58" Lon by Ch 75° 40'
