

Saturday May the 6th the 1848
the first part light winds from the
E and veering heading to the northward
imploids in main a fine light rain
set shortened sail the middle the
same at daylight made sail the wind
from the S and veering heading to the
westward sited nothing so ends this day
Lat by Obs 28° 48' Lon by Ch 78° 48'

Sunday May the 7th the 1848
the first part light winds from N E
and veering heading to the south and
west at 8 Pm wore ship at sunset
shortened sail the middle the same
at daylight made sail latter the
the wind from about and good weather
heading E S E so ends this day
Lat by Obs 28° 52' Lon by Ch 78° 50'

Monday May the 8th the 1848
the first part light winds from
S W heading S E at sunset tacked
and shortened sail middle the same
at daylight made sail and tacked to
the S E wind S W and fine weather
put up the masts so ends this day
Lat by Obs 28° 58' Lon by Ch 77° 44'

Tuesday May the 9th the 1848
the first part moderate winds from
S W and veering heading to the S W
at sunset shortened sail and stowed
N by compass middle and latter the
same at daylight made all sail imploids
in painting the fore masts so ends
Lat by Obs 29° 45' Lon by Ch 77° 24'

Wednesday May the 10th the 1848
the first part light winds from S W
steering S E at sunset took in topgallant
sail and stowed S W E the middle and
latter the same at daylight made all
sail and one sail so ends this day
Lat by Obs 29° 29' Lon by Ch 76° 51'

Thursday May the 11th the 1848
the first part moderate winds from
S W steering S E at 11 Pm spoke the Bunt
Chase Brownell 19 masts this out 95° 26' 66"
the capt went on board at dusk
returned shortened sail and stowed S W E
the middle and latter the same at
daylight made sail saw three sails
so ends this day Lat 30° 38' Lon 76° 18'

Friday May the 12th the 1848
the first part strong winds from N
steering S W by 8 at sunset took in sail
and luffed to the wind to N W at
daylight the wind hauled to the N W
made sail headed to the S E saw two
sails latter squally took in gill and
main sail so ends this day
Lat by Obs 31° 52' Lon by Ch 75° 07'

Saturday May the 13th the 1848
the first part strong winds from
N W and squally weather steering
S E at 3 Pm steered S at sunset
took in sail and luffed to the N W E
middle the same at daylight made sail
steered S E saw one sail so ends this day
Lat by Obs 31° 58' Lon by Ch 75° 55'

Sunday May the 14th the 1848
the first part fresh winds from S W
steering S E at sunset took in sail
and luffed to the westward the middle
wind the same steered S E at daylight
moderate made all sail latter wind
hauled to N so ends this day
Lat by Obs 31° 21' Lon by Ch 76° 20'

Monday May the 15th the 1848
the first part light winds from
W steering S E saw one sail at sun
set shortened sail middle nearly calm
at daylight calm made same sail one sail
in sight sent down the fore top sail
and shortened it on the foot so ends
