the first part moderate winds from
S.W. heading to the westward saw
green joses saw two sails steering to the
eastward at sunset took in sail through
the night the same at daylight moderate
made sail saw the Isle of St. Paul
bearing S.W. 16 miles at 7 AM took up
found the Chronometer 2.5 miles S.W. the
west of us so ends this day
Lat by Obs 32° 34' N Lon by Obs 64° 26'

Thursday May the 25th the 1848
the first part light winds from S.W.
heading S.W. saw two sails at sun
set took in sail through the night
the same at daylight made sail latter
moderate wind from S.E. and heavy
weather heading E the watches implied
in main then line put a new head
in the but so ends this day
Lat by Obs 32° 22' N Lon by Obs 65° 49'

Friday May the 26th the 1848
the first part moderate winds
from S.E. and cloudy heading
E saw one sail at 8 PM took in
at sunset shortened through the
night the same at daylight made
sail latter wind S.W. heading W turned
up the main topgallant back stays and
set them up striped the fore and fore
topmast sprits and surved it over so ends
Lat by Obs 32° 22' N Lon by Obs 65° 00' W

Saturday May the 27th the 1848
the first part light winds from
S.W. saw three sails at 6 PM saw
a school of blackfish to the seaward
board one but the fish came to the
windward board the other boats
could not get nigh them at 2 PM
came on board at sunset took in
sail the middle the same at daylight
made sail latter wind from S.W. steering
S.W. by 10 so ends this day
Lat by Obs 32° 22' N

Sunday May the 28th the 1848
the first part light winds from
S.W. steering S.W. by 10 at 7 PM spoke
the Franklin 1700 lbs of oil the Capt
went on board took in sail the Bark
Elizabeth Elanders 700 lbs at 8 PM
the Capt came on board headed to
the southward at daylight made sail
at 6 PM took ship the Elizabeth
off the lee bow and Dr off the weather
bow at 7 AM the masts of the Elisebeth
th came on board the Capt came
went on board of them, steered to
the northward so ends this day
Lat by Obs 33° 10' 58" N Lon by Obs 65° 49'

Monday May the 29th the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze from
the W steering to the northward
the Franklin steered to the eastward
at dark mate went home and the Capt
returned took in sail had a squall of
rain heading to the north the middle
the same at daylight strong winds from
W.S.E. heading E the Elizabeth in sight took
out for bread and water the Franklin
past us heading to the S.W. so ends this day
Lat by Obs 33° 44' N Lon by Obs 65° 16'

Tuesday May the 30th the 1848
the first part strong winds from
E.W. heading S.E. at 4 PM spoke the
ship at sunset spoke the Elizabeth
headed to the W at daylight made sail the
wind from E.S.E. heading W.E. latter the same
the Dr and Elizabeth in sight so ends
Lat by Obs 34° 12' N Lon by Obs 65° 16'

Wednesday May the 31st the 1848
the first part strong winds from S.W.
heading S.E. at 4 PM spoke the Elizabeth
the Capt came on board at sunset took
in sail at 8 PM the Capt went home the
middle the same at daylight strong winds
from S.W. and cloudy set mainsail up and try
sail latter the same so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 57' N
