the first part strong winds from S.W. heading S.E. took in mainsail gill and reefed the topsail at 5 PM took in fore topsail and set the fore spencer sent down the main ~~spencer~~ and yard and they lost one of the lifts at sunset took in the foresail the bark in sight the middle the same at daylight took set the fore sail and fore topsail and turned one reef out of the topsail heading S.E. at 8 AM came on to quinn took in the fore topsail under the Elise the sea and shot out on her weather bow latter the wind from S.W. and rainey so ends this day

Wednesday June the 2nd the 1848

the first part strong winds from N.W. and thick with some rain steard S.E. at 5:30 PM spoke the Elisebeth took in the fore sail and hauled to the wind to the S.E. the middle the same at daylight clear weather again S.W. set the fore sail steard S.E. by 8 AM ends Lat by Obs 33° 44' N Long by the 60° 50' W

Saturday June the 5th the 1848

the first part strong winds from N.W. steering S.E. at 5 PM hauled to the wind to the N.E. at sunset spoke the bark took in fore sail and fore topsail through the night the same at daylight rather more moderate turned the reefs out of the topsails and set main topgallant sail and steard S.E. so ends the Elisebeth the in sight. ends

Sunday June the 6th the 1848

the first part moderate winds from N. heading S by compass at 5:30 PM spoke the bark the capt came on board at sunset took in sail and headed S.E. the middle the wind hauled to S.W. at daylight made sail steard S.E. latter strong winds and rugged the bark off the starboard beam so ends Lat by Obs 33° 50' N Long by the 57° 10' W

Monday June the 5th the 1848

the first part strong winds and rugged steering S by N at 10 PM took in main topgallant sail and doubled reefed the topsails and hauled to the wind to the N.W. wind S.W. at 2:30 PM took in the fore topsail at sunset took in the fore sail and lost reefed the main topsail the Elisebeth off the weather beam through the night some rain at daylight rainey at 7 AM wore ship at 10 AM set the foresail latter thick cloudy so ends

Tuesday June the 6th the 1848

the first part strong winds from N. heading S.W. and thick weather at 9 PM took a squall from the N.W. took in the foresail the bark in sight and one sail off the weather bow the sun set clear to night so i hope we shall have a good day to morrow the middle the same at daylight made sail heading S.W. wind from N.W. took bark in sight at 7 AM wore ship the watches implied in filing new vial again so ends this day Lat by Obs 33° 21' N Long by the

Wednesday June the 7th the 1848

the first part light winds from N.W. heading N at 5 PM spoke the Elisebeth the bark by in company 400 barrels the capt went on board at sunset took in sail at 9 PM the Capt came on board brought a spar for a sprissle yard the middle moderate winds from S.W. heading to the westward the Elisebeth in sight saw two sails heading westward the other heading Eastward the watches implied in in brain out the after hole under fixed four cask of salt water so ends Lat by Obs 33° 50' N Long by the 52° 52' W
