

Thursday, June the 2th the 1848

the first part moderate winds from S.W. heading to the westward at 6:30 am saw the Elisebeth boat down near for her found them to be after blackfish saw the fish but they was going quick to windward did not lose track in sail the capt of the bark came on board at 8:30 am went back headed to the S.E. middle thick and rainey at daylight thick latter about the same at 11:30 am turned the reefs out of the top sails the bark off the weather quarter so ends let by Obs 33° 5.8' Lon by Obs 52° 00' W

Friday, June the 3th the 1848

the first part moderate winds from S.W. steering S.E. at sunset took in sail and luffed to the wind to the westward the bark in sight picked up a fine ship through the night the same at daylight made sail steard S.E. the bark in company riged the springsail yard over the bow and set up the gill quies saw porpoises so ends this day let by Obs 33° 04' N Lon by Obs

Saturday, June the 4th the 1848

the first part brisk breez from S.W. heading S.E. the Elisebeth in sight took out the blocks out of the marten sail quies and spliced in some deadeyes and set them up at sunset took in sail at 8 am the bark spoke us through the moderate at daylight made sail at 10 am steard E and E.S. & saw porpoises saw two sails off the lee bow the bark off the lee beam so ends this day

Sunday, June the 5th the 1848

the first part fresh winds from S.W. steering E and E by passed two brig heading to the southward the Elisebeth off the lee quarter at sunset took in sail and hauled back the fore topsail at 10 am braced forward headed to the Southward at daylight nearly calm made all sail the bark in sight latter a moderate wind from W steering E so ends let by Obs 32° 41' 10" W

Monday, June the 6th the 1848

the first part light winds from W steering E at sunset took in sail and luffed to the wind to the southward capt Dependens came on board at 9 pm went home through the night the same at daylight a brisk breez from S.W. made sail steard E and E.S. & saw blackfish and porpoises latter the same so ends let by Obs 32° 56' 08" Lon by Obs 53° 11' 40"

Tuesday, June the 7th the 1848

the first part a fresh breez from S.W. steering S.E. by E the Elisebeth in company saw plenty squid at sunset took in sail spoke the bark headed to the S.E. the middle the same at daylight made sail headed to the S.E. the water pay imployed in strapping the topgallant hal yards blocks so ends let by Obs 32° 58' 08" Lon by Obs 54° 50'

Wednesday, June the 8th the 1848

the first part a fresh breez from S.W. heading S.E. at 6 am the bark run down and spoke us and the Capt came on board run down and spoke the Brig March Wood 7 months out of oil had seen whales five lines in two weeks took in sail headed to the S.E. middle wind and weather the same at daylight made sail the Brig and bark in sight latter so ends let by Obs 32° 58' 08" Lon by Obs 70° 00' W
