

Wednesday June the 21<sup>st</sup> the 1848  
the first part light winds all  
round the compass steering ESE  
saw the Dr boiling at sunset  
took in the first sails through  
the night the same at daylight  
made all sail light winds from E  
and veering headed to the North and  
East saw the Dr heading to the  
southward turned up the  
fore topmast rigging and striped  
one of the main topmast stays  
and surved it over so ends this day  
Lat by Obs 51° 59' N Lon by Obs 91° 50' W

Thursday June the 22<sup>nd</sup> the first part  
light winds from SE heading ESE  
at sunset took in the light sails  
tacked ship one sail in sight the  
middle the same at daylight made  
all sail better squarer and rainer  
wind all round the compass took  
in main topmast stays so ends  
Lat by Obs 51° 45' N Lon by Obs 57° 30' W

Friday June the 23<sup>rd</sup> the 1848  
the first part light winds and  
veering all round heading different  
ways at sunset calm took in sail  
the middle the same at daylight  
made all sail the wind from E  
heading SSE at 6 PM wore ship turned  
up the main topmast rigging on the  
starboard side better the same so ends  
Lat by Obs 51° 49' N Lon by Obs 58° 20' W

Saturday June the 24<sup>th</sup> the 1848  
the first part light winds from SE  
heading SSE at sunset tacked and  
took in sail the middle the same  
at daylight calm made sail at  
9 AM took a breeze from SW  
heading southward implevied in  
brain out for bread and water  
at 1 PM wore ship steered SE  
so ends Lat by Obs 51° 59' N Lon 59° 00' W

Sunday June the 25<sup>th</sup> the 1848  
the first part light winds from  
SW steering NE at sunset took in  
sail and heved to the wind to the  
through the night the same at day  
light made sail at 7 AM wore ship  
steered at 9 AM sighted a sperm whale  
at 10 board but the got side of us  
could not get up my a net to get  
fast darter two from each boat  
could not reach them so ends in chase  
Lat by Obs 51° 59' N Lon by Obs 91° 50' W

Monday June the 26<sup>th</sup> the 1848  
the first part light winds from  
SW off chasing the whales at 2 PM  
came on board and took dinner and  
board and chased till sunset came  
on board took in sail headed to the  
SW this is Bisset back the middle  
the same at daylight made sail head  
ed to the SW at 9 AM wore ship steered  
S implevied fitting boat sails so ends  
Lat by Obs 52° 30' N Lon by Obs 49° 16' W

Tuesday June the 27<sup>th</sup> the 1848  
the first part light winds from SW  
steering by the wind to the SW  
at sunset took in sail through the  
middle the same at daylight made  
sail at 6 PM sighted a sperm whale  
at 10 board and great party and  
struck and killed five boats and the  
school went to the windward the  
boats in chase took the whales along  
side at 12 O'clock the boats came on  
board so ends Lat by Obs 52° 02' N Lon 48° 11' W

Wednesday June the 28<sup>th</sup> the 1848  
the first part moderate winds from  
W at 11 AM commenced cutting the whales at  
4 PM finished wore ship to the SW at  
dark took in sail through the night  
wind SW with squall of rain at 1 AM fitted  
up started a fire at 1 PM rained had to  
put out the fire so ends
