

Thursday July the 14th the 1848
the first part moderate winds
from S.E. steering W.S.W. saw four
porpoises at sunset took in sail
and luffed to the wind S.W.
through the night the same at
daylight made sail at 6 AM tacked
ship latter fresh breeze from E.S.E.
imploded in bracing out for water
on different tacks so ends this day
Lat by Obs 31° 55' N Lon by Ch 93° 45'

Friday July the 15th the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze from
E.S.E. heading E.S.E. through the
night the same latter do sailed nothing
so ends Lat by Obs 33° 00' N

Saturday July the 16th the 1848
the first part light winds from S.E.
heading S.E. at 4 PM sighted blackfish
board ~~and~~ Labord and went with
struck one Labord boat and sailed
took him along side and went off
and chased again could not get
up to them came on board and
cleared away the fish and washed
off through the night the same at
daylight the wind hauled to S. Steard
E.S.E. sighted a sail so ends this day
Lat by Obs 33° 16' N Lon by Ch 47° 09'

Sunday July the 17th the 1848
the first part light winds from
the S and veering steering E.S.E.
set the fore topmast staying sail
middle the same latter do imploded
in staying blocks and turned up
the fore topmast rigging on the
labord side so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 37' N Lon by Ch 46° 40'

Tuesday July the 18th the 1848
the first part light winds from
steering S.E. by E sighted a schooner
heading Westward bailed the black
fish sighted a shoal of blackfish did
not lose through the night the
same at daylight nearly calm
at 6 AM sighted blackfish board
Labord and went aboard and struck
and killed three and took them
on board and cleared them away
so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 12' N Lon by Ch 46° 55'

Wednesday July the 19th the 1848
the first part calm imploded in
beating the blubber and minding
it through weather the same latter
do imploded in putting up royal rigging
and other gobs on the rigging so ends
Lat by Obs 35° 35' N Lon by Ch 46° 25'

Thursday July the 20th the 1848
the first part calm through the
night the same latter a light breeze
from S.W. steering E.S.E. bailed the
blackfish and turned up the main
topmast rigging saw a bark heading
Northward by the wind so ends
Lat by Obs 36° 00' N Lon by Ch 46° 28'

Friday July the 21st the 1848
the first part light winds from
S.W. steering E.S.E. finished bailing
and bailed up the vibs barrels through
the night the same latter a fresh breeze
with light dashes of rain steard the
same imploded staying blocks and other
small gobs so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 47' N Lon by Ch 45° 00'
