

Sunday August the 6th the 1848
the first part light winds from N.W.
heading W.S.W. sent down the old
main topsail sent up the new one
and bent it at sunset took in main
sail and going to agantail through
the wind and weather the same at day
light made sail the wind to the W.
heading S.W. put out a large fore
studingsail boom bulby veler with
worm saw grampses so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 12' 20" Lon by Ch 35° 20'

Monday August the 7th the 1848
the first part light winds from W and
veering heading southward by the
wind yet sunset took the light sails
through the night the same at daylight
made all sail latter a brisk breeze from
W heading southward impleid in tur
ning up the fore and main rigging ends
Lat by Obs 35° 45' 08" Lon by Ch 35° 11' 38"

Tuesday August the 8th the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze from
W heading S.W. impleid on the
rigging at sunset took in main
topgalant sail the middle the wind
from the North heading W.S.W. at day
light made all sail latter the same
impleid in capping the rigging and
seading up the ends one sail in sight so ends
Lat by Obs 35° 50' 18" Lon by Ch 34° 20'

Wednesday August the 9th the 1848
the first part light winds from N
steering W at sunset took in main
topgalant sail through the night
nearly the same at daylight set
main topgalant sail latter light
wind and bafin steering W set
up the gib quies and did some other
small jobs so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 22' 25" Lon by Ch 35° 12' 39"

Thursday August the 10th the 1848
the first part light winds from
Northward steering W set up the
fore stay through the night calm at
3 PM took a breeze from steering W
latter the same turned up the fore
and main rigging so ends this day
Lat by Obs

Friday August the 11th the 1848
the first part light winds from N.W.
heading W.S.W. at sunset took in
main topgalant sail the middle the
same at daylight set topgalant sail
latter de caped and seized up the
cords saw a ship steering S.E. ends
Lat by Obs 35° 30' 18" Lon by Ch 36° 18'

Saturday August the 12th the 1848
the first part nearly calm the same
the night the same at daylight a light
breeze from from the steering N.W.
one sail in sight latter wind hap
lin heading from N.W. to S.W. ends
Lat by Obs 35° 45' 08" Lon by Ch 37° 20'

Sunday August the 13th the 1848
the first part light winds from
W heading S.W. at 3 PM saw a
whale and killed 5 PM took the whale
along side and commenced cutting
at 6 PM the over gage at through
the night calm at daylight commenced
cutting latter the same so ends this day

Monday August the 14th the 1848
the first part impleid in cutting
at 3 PM finished cutting and cleared
up and went to boating through
the night calm latter the same
impleid in boating saw a body
to windward so ends this day
