

Wednesday August the 23th the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze from
SE steering NW saw breaches in for
them did not see them again at
sunset shortened sail at 12 Pm
luffed to the wind to the Eastward
at daylight made sail at 7 Pm
steered NW by compass so ends
Lat by Obs 34° 28' N Lon by Ch 72° 30'

Thursday August the 24th the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze from
SE steering NW at sunset took in
sail to and luffed to the wind to
the Southward with the fore top
sail aback at 8 Pm hoisted forward
through the night the same at day
light made sail at 10 Pm steered NW
saw nothing so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 37' N Lon by Ch 46° 55'

Friday August the 25th the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze from
the SE steering NW at 6 Pm the
wind hauled to SW at sunset
shortened sail heading NW
through the night the same at
daylight made sail heading NW
latter the same so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 00' N Lon by Ch 44° 33'

Saturday August the 26th the 1848
the first part strong winds from
W heading NW at 1 Pm tacked
ship at sunset shortened sail through
the night had some squalls of rain
at daylight made sail latter the same
at 10 Pm took in main topgallant sail
so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 30' N Lon by Ch 43° 51' W

Sunday August the 27th the 1848
the first part strong winds from
NW heading W bent the new main
topgallant sail at 6 Pm spoke the Bark
German Clark 550 lbs the Capt came
on board at 8 Pm went on board
through the night the same at day
light set whole topsails up and main
sail at 8 Pm had a squall doubled
reefed the topsails at 10 Pm hoisted up
turned the reefs out of the main topsails
and set main topgallant sail so ends
Lat by Obs 33° 40' N Lon by Ch 43° 00'

Monday August the 28th the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze
from W and veering heading South
ward at sunset shortened sail
through the night the same at
daylight made sail latter do so ends
Lat by Obs 32° 10' N Lon by Ch 43° 09'

Tuesday August the 29th the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze from W
and veering heading Southward
at sunset tacked ship and shorte
ned sail through the night the
same at daylight made sail latter
squally at 11 Pm tacked ship
so ends this day and saw nothing
Lat by Obs 32° 10' N Lon by Ch 43° 20'

Wednesday August the 30th the 1848
the first part strong winds from
NW heading W by compass at
sunset shortened sail through the
night the same at daylight the
sail at 7 Pm tacked ship latter do
saw nothing so ends this day
Lat by Obs 31° 09' N Lon by Ch 43° 16'
