

Thursday August the 1st the 1848
the first part strong winds
from W heading N W at
sunset shortened sail through
the night the same at daylight
strong winds from W and ruggled
heading N W set gill and mainsail
at 10 AM had it squaled took in
gill and mainsail so ends this day
Lat by Obs 32° 00' Lon by the 43° 50'

Friday August the 1st the 1848
the first part strong winds
from W heading N W through
the night the same at daylight
made all sail heading N by the
wind latter the same so ends
Lat by Obs 32° 36' Lon by the 44° 46'

Saturday Sept the 2nd the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze
from W heading N W at 4 PM
on bent the old foresail and
bent the new one at sunset
shortened sail through the
night the same at daylight made
sail latter do seted grampases so ends
Lat by Obs 33° 44' Lon by the 44° 44'

Sunday Sept the 3rd the 1848
the first part strong winds from
Wind veering with a heavy swell
from N W at 11 AM took in the
topgallant sail at sunset shortened
sail for the night the middle the
the wind hauled to the N W nor ship
at daylight made sail with a
fresh breeze from the N W heading
N W seted nothing so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 17' Lon by the 45° 05'

Monday Sept the 4th the 1848
the first part light winds from
N W heading N W at 4 PM wore
ship at sunset shortened sail through
the night the same at 8 AM wore ship
at daylight made sail latter nearly
calm on bent the fore topsail and
sent it down and stoped in two cloths
in the lunt and middle stitched it
before the close reef so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 02'

Tuesday Sept the 5th the 1848
the first part light winds from
E and veering heading N W through
at 1:30 PM sent up the topsail
and bent it at sunset shortened
sail the middle the wind hauled to
the S W steering N E turned the
reefs out of the main topsail and
set main topgallant sail latter the
same broke out for ~~water~~ bread
sited grampases so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 44'

Wednesday Sept the 6th the 1848
the first part light winds from the South
steering N E by Compass seted kites
at sunset shortened sail through
the night weather the same at 10 PM
hauled to the wind to the W at day
light squaled made sail seted a brig
steering Eastward at 11 AM steared N E
latter the same so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 30'

Thursday Sept the 7th the 1848
the first part strong winds from S W
and veering with squalls of thunder
and heavy rain steering N E at
sunset took in the fore topsail and
close reefed the main and hauled to the
wind N W through the night the same
at daylight nearly
clear made sail steared S by N one
sail in sight at 11 AM squall
more for than for wind to be
