Friday Sept the 8th the 1848
the first part strong winds from
W and very rugged tiding the whales
at 1:30 PM took them along side part
ed from them both took them along
side again and went to cutting ypt
in both the bodages through the
night weather nearly the same at
daylight went to cutting at 3 PM
finish cutting and clear the heads and
washed off so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 20' Lon by Obs 46° 25'

Saturday Sept the 9th the 1848
the first part strong winds from
W heading N.W. at 3 PM wave
ship imploded in boiling at 4 PM
strong gales from W and thick at 5 AM
had a heavy squall of thunder and
rain put out the fires at 4 PM
started the fires again at 5 PM
had a squall of rain put the
fires out at 6 PM clear up
but black squalls and a heavy
fog started the fires so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 00' Lon by Obs 47° 00'

Sunday Sept the 10th the 1848
the first part strong gales from
W and very rugged heading
N.W. imploding in boiling at 5 PM
shiped a sea put the fires out
through the night moderate same
at 4:30 PM started the fires and set
the fore sail latter set appalled reef
topails imploding in boiling the wind from
the W heading E.N.E. so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 59' Lon by Obs 44° 00'

Monday Sept the 11th the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze from from
the W steering E imploding in boiling at
3 PM finished and washed off through
the night moderate at daylight
made sail wind from W steering E
imploding in filigree the spades and cutting
gear latter steered E.N.E. so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 49' N

Tuesday Sept the 12th the 1848
the first part light winds from the
W heading E.N.E. at sunset shortened
sail through the night the same at
daylight made sail and commenced trac
ing out for water and to stop down
the oil so ends this day saw blackfish
Lat by Obs 36° 17' N

Wednesday Sept the 13th the 1848
the first part moderate winds
from W steering E by S imploding in
steering down at 4:30 PM finished
and washed off set a ship through
the night nearly the same at daylight
thick with some rain at 10 AM the wind
shifted to the W and clear up set gill
and mainsail so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 49' N Lon by Obs 40° 59'

Thursday Sept the 14th the 1848
the first part moderate winds from
the W and veering steering E.N.E. at
sunset took in topgallant sail and gill
through the night the same set topgallant
sail and gill at daylight light winds from
the Eastward heading E.S.E. so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 47'

Friday Sept the 15th the 1848
the first part wind light and baffin all round
the compass at sunset shortened sail middle the
wind from S.E. heading E at daylight made
sail latter the same so ends this day
Lat by Obs 37° 09' N Lon by Obs 38° 56' W
