

Saturday Sept the 16th the 1848
the first part light winds from
the S heading E & E sited a Bry
saw grampuses at sunset took in
sail through the night the
same at daylight made sail
latter wind S W and cloudy weather
steering SE so ends this day
Lat by Obs 37° 45' N Lon by Ch 36° 56'

Sunday Sept the 17th the 1848
the first part a fine breeze from
S W steering SE the middle light
wind latter nearly calm so ends
Lat by Obs 37° 10' 40" N Lon by Ch 35° 00'

Monday Sept the 18th the 1848
the first part calm at 2nd 30 PM
sited a large sperm whale board
but it was so calm could not
get to him at dark came on board
through the night wind very
light and baffin all round heading
southward latter a breeze from E & E
heading S so ends this day
Lat by Obs 38° 45' 48" N Lon by Ch 37° 37'

Tuesday Sept the 19th the 1848
the first part moderate wind
from E heading S & E set up bab
stays and bowsprit sprouts sited
grampuses through the night near
the same latter so at 6 AM sited
a large sperm whale at 9 board
at N struck starboard boat and
stove her out the line picked
up the and boat and took them
on board did not see the whale
again so ends this day
Lat by Obs 36° 10' N Lon by Ch 34° 50'

Wednesday Sept the 20th the 1848
the first part light winds from
E & E and veering her boat down
running down the sun glade to look
for the whale at 2 PM came
on board took the over head boat
off and put her on the cranes and
put the other in her place at 2nd 30 PM
spoke the bark Champion Gardner 20
months out 300 sperm and 50 whale the
Capt came on board and staid until 4 PM
through the night wind light and
baffin heading different ways latter
calm the bark in sight so ends
Lat by Obs 35° 00' N Lon by Ch 34° 25'

Thursday Sept the 21st the 1848
the first part calm saw grampuses
the bark in sight through the
night slight breeze from S W
steering SE latter the wind
broke to the N and freshened steard
E & E so ends this day impleid in men
din the boat

Friday Sept the 22nd the 1848
the first part a fresh breeze from
N to N E steering E by at 4 PM took
in top galant sails through the
night wind N E and thick cloudy
weather heading E & E latter strong
winds from E and veering at 1 PM
were ship impleid mending the
boat sited a brig so ends
Lat by Obs 34° 19' N Lon by Ch 32° 05'

Saturday Sept the 23rd the 1848
the first part strong winds from
E and rugged heading N N E under
double reef topsails put the
boat overhead through the night
moderated set whole topsails and
main top galant sail latter the
same sited a sail so ends this day
Lat by Obs 35° 41' N
