

Friday Oct the 27th the 1848
the first part fresh trades off
and on at 11am the boat went
on shore, at 5pm the capt came
off with some wood and 15 hundred
oranges and two men from the Counsel
to take home steered to the Western
at 8pm the wind from the W
and very light through the night
on different tack, wind light
at daylight the wind WSW
heading NW sited 30 miles

Saturday Oct the 28th the 1848
the first part light winds from
the SW and very heading
northward at 1:30pm took
the trades steered SW by W middle
the same latter the same sited
again so ends this day
Lat by Obs 16° 22' N Lon by Obs 25° 55' W

Sunday Oct the 29th the 1848
the first part strong trades
steering SW by W middle the
same latter more moderate
set to the studing sail so ends
Lat by Obs 17° 05' N Lon by Obs 28° 58' W

Monday Oct the 30th the 1848
the first part moderate trades
from NE steering SW by W
through the trades light and buff
latter a steady breeze washed the
brig round on the inside for painting
so ends this day Lat 17° 42' N Lon 30° 40' W

Tuesday Oct the 31st the first part
moderate trades steering SW by W
broke out flour and bread middle
the same latter so watches
implied in painting the brig
inside so ends this day
Lat by Obs 18° 17' N Lon by Obs 34° 25' W

Wednesday Nov the 1st the 1848
the first part moderate
trades steering SW by W implied
painting through the night
the same latter do implied in
painting the spars so ends this
day Lat by Obs 18° 59' N Lon by Obs 37° 37' W

Thursday Nov the 2nd the 1848
the first part moderate winds
from NE steering SW by W implied
painting middle the same latter
do implied painting so ends this day
Lat by Obs 19° 20' N Lon by Obs 38° 00' W

Friday Nov the 3rd the 1848
the first part light trades
steering SW by W implied in
painting at 7pm the wind broke
by the southward middle
the same latter do broke out for
water so ends this day
Lat by Obs 19° 49' N Lon by Obs 38° 35' W

Saturday Nov the 4th the 1848
the first part light winds from SW
heading W by W through the night
calm at daylight a light air from
Eastward steered W by W latter the
same sited two sails painted the
stern so ends this day
Lat by Obs 19° 52' N Lon by Obs 38° 49' W

Sunday Nov the 5th the 1848
the first part light winds from
E steering W by W painted the
overhead boat at 5pm set
the studing sail through the night
the same latter a fresh breeze from
S by E steering W by W so ends
Lat by Obs 20° 12' N Lon by Obs 40° 29' W
