

Thursday Nov the 23rd the 1848
the first part strong winds
from W and veering to S.W.
heading from N.W. to S.W.
at 7 P.M. tacked ship through the
night wind light from S and
veering to S.W. heading to the
westward latter the same
and riged the wheel to clear so ends
Lat by Obs 23° 5' 48" Lon by Ch 65° 35'

Friday Nov the 24th the 1848
the first part light winds from
N.W. and veering heading to the
westward at 7 P.M. took slight
breeze from S.E. and veering staid
N.W. middle the same at
daylight wind came to E set
sailing sail staid the same
latter the same so ends this day
Lat by Obs 29° 0' 34" Lon by Ch 66° 45'

Saturday Nov the 25th the 1848
the first part moderate wind
from E and veering steering N.W.
varnished the wheel middle part
wind from S.E. steering N.W. at 7 P.M.
thick and rainey at 9 P.M. spread up
wind shifted to S.W. staid the same
latter the same so ends this day
Lat by Obs 30° 24' 8" Lon by Ch 67° 50' 78"

Sunday Nov the 26th the 1848
the first part fresh winds from
S.W. steering S.W. hanged the wheel
at 1 P.M. had a squall of heavy rain
from the W took in sail at 10 P.M. 30 P.M.
lited up wind shifted to S.W. set
the topsails, gill and courses at 4 P.M.
set topgalant sail, heaped S.W. at
6 P.M. squally with heavy rain
took in to double reefed topsails
saw two seals so ends this day
Lat by Obs 32° 00' 18" Lon by Ch 69° 30'

Monday Nov the 27th the 1848
the first part strong winds from
W and veering and thick weather
sited two ships standing on toward
middle wind from S.W. and veering
heading Northward at 4 P.M. tacked
at 4 tacked again at daylight moderate
made all sail wind the same heading
N.W. at 7 P.M. the wind came to S.W.
tacked ship latter the same so ends
Lat by Obs 32° 5' 38" Lon by Ch 69° 50'

Tuesday Nov the 28th the 1848
the first part moderate winds
from the S heading W. at daylight
wind N.W. heading S.W. at daylight
wind would to S.E. and breasted up
headed N.W. at 8 P.M. double reefed
the topsails and sent down topgalant
yards so ends this day a brig in sight

Wednesday Nov the 29th the 1848
the first part strong gales from S.E.
heading N.W. and heavy rain
at 1 P.M. took in fore topsail and
courses and close reefed the main top
sail and close reefed the try sail and
set fore spencer took up the lee yards
and battened down the hatches the
middle moderate set double reefed
topsails and courses at 5 P.M. turned the
reefs out of the topsails headed S.W. and
veering latter the same sent up main
topgalant yard so ends this day
Lat by Obs 33° 5' 38" Lon by Ch 72° 02' 48"

Thursday Nov the 30th the 1848
the first part light winds from S.E.
and veering heading Northward sent
up fore top galant yard middle light
winds from S.E. and veering to S.W. clearing
latter the same so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 5' 48" Lon by Ch 72° 50'
