

Thursday Dec the 1st the 1848
the first part nearly calm steering
when she would steer middle light
winds from SW and veering to S steering
by compass at daylight wind shifted
to W light winds all round the compass
at 10 o'clock took a brace from S
set standing sails steady & put the
sheuler and deck put below and
took up the platform so ends this day
Set by Obs 5.5" 400' Lon by Obs 71" 5' 28"

Friday Dec the 2nd the 1848
the first part a moderate breeze
from S by E steering S and S by W
middle strong winds S by E steering
S by W latter the same so ends this day
Set by Obs 5.5" 400' Lon by Obs 71" 5' 50"

Saturday Dec the 3rd the 1848
the first part strong winds from
S and thick weather with some
rain steering S took in to anchor
reef topsail at 4 PM wind hauled
to W by W set hauled reefed topsails
a 10 PM turned the reef out at 11
at 12 PM set main top gulant sail
at 4 PM strong winds doubled reefed
the topsails soundly in 35 fath of
water latter weather the same
the sun at 6 PM set at 7 PM
so ends this day

Sunday the 4th the 1848
the first part strong winds from
W steering different ~~the~~ Coaches seen
saw several sails saw a whaling ship
steering E by N at 3 PM hauled round
the S end of Black Island for New
Sept at 5.30 PM came to anchor
through the night quite moderate
latter wind from S by W at 10 AM the
left left the Brig in my care
for home so ends this day

Tuesday Dec the 5th the 1848
the first part moderate several
schooners got under way and went
out side but returned middle
and latter the same so ends

Wednesday Dec the 6th the 1848
the first part wind moderate
from Eastward and cloudy at
4 PM the Capt returned with
a pilot through the night moderate
at 10 PM took the anchor the
wind from the N took out the
harbor cum in thick run for
Seunit river so ends this day

Thursday Dec the 7th the 1848
the first part moderate
winds from S by W came to
river at 4.30 PM came to
anchor wester for land Point
through the night the same
latter tilted up some got under
way run down for the night
the Point cum up thick put back
and came to anchor so ends

Friday Dec the 8th the 1848
the first part light winds
from S by E and veering and thick
fog through the night the same
latter so ends this day

Saturday Dec the 9th the 1848
the first part wind from S by W
and thick fog at sunset lit up
some
