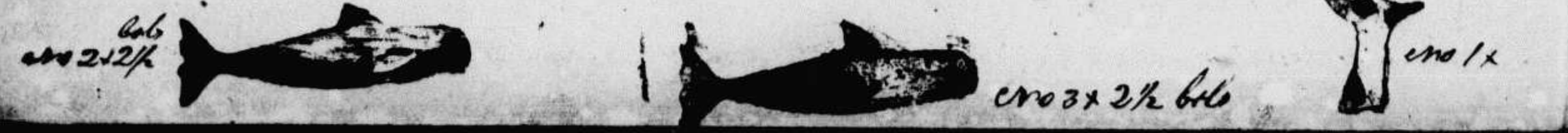


14 Remarks on boarder Thursday June 20th 1849
these 24 hours begins with light winds from the westward & fine weather steering SBE watch employed in ships duty fishing for whaling at 3 PM saw a strong sail steering to the south at 5 PM we had some thunder & lightning at 6 PM down shortened sail & staid East latter part of the day light winds & pleasant weather much sail staid EBE watch employed in ships duty towing down the new rigging & other various kinds of work on board at midnight staid EBE so ended this day
Lat in 4 09 31.11 N Long in 4 Chronometer 51.20 West

15 Remarks on Thursday June 21st 1849
these 24 hours begins with light winds from the westward & fine weather steering SBE watch employed in ships duty towing the new rigging & other various kinds of work on board at sun down double reefed the topsails & lay aback at 11 PM down full latter part of the day fine weather & light winds from the N by E at 5 AM made sail & staid SE watch employed in ships duty various kinds of work on board the day ended fine weather staid SBE
Lat in 4 09 31.01 N Long in 4 Chronometer 49.40 West

16 Remarks on Friday June 22nd 1849
these 24 hours begins with light winds from the N by E & fine weather steering SBE watch employed in ships duty at 2 PM saw a strong sail at 3 PM staid South by the wine at sun down shortened sail & staid by the wine to the N by E middle & latter part of the day fine breeze from the westward & fine weather some passing showers of rain watch employed in ships duty at 5 PM made all sail & staid SBE at 6 PM saw large quantities of gulf weed so ended day
Lat in 4 09 32.15 N Long in 4 Chronometer 49.27 West

17 Remarks on Saturday June 23rd 1849
these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the N by E & fine weather under all sail steering SBE watch employed in ships duty saw large quantities of gulf weed at 3 PM staid SBE at 5 PM saw a strong ship steering to the Eastward at sun down shortened sail at 9 a blintz of lightning & some thunder latter part of the day light air & wind from the westward & fine pleasant weather at 5 PM made all sail & staid by the wine to the N by E watch employed in ships duty at 6 PM were ship to the N by E at 9 PM saw blackfish & lowered for them & struck three & saved 2 of them landed & raised back at 11 took them on board the wine beered from N by E staid by the wine to the N by E so ended this day
Lat in 4 09 31.14 N Long in 4 Chronometer 49.35 West



18 Remarks on Sunday June 24th 1849
these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from N by E & fine weather steering to the N by E the wine at 1 PM lowered after blackfish could not get fast came on board & pulled our fish on board & landed & mended the blubber one strong sail off our weather quarter at 5 PM took ship at sun down spoke the brig governor bellins of new burgeo capt baker came on board & got his letter 87 days out 30 lbs at 8 went on board were shortened sail & staid to the N by E the wine latter part of the day fine breeze from N by E at 5 PM made all sail at 6 PM took ship to the north the day ended fine weather nothing in sight

19 Remarks on Monday June 25th 1849
these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the N by E at 1 PM staid SBE & SBE at 4 PM some passing squalls a staid at 4 PM saw a school of sperm whale leaving SBE 2 miles off going quick to the N by E lowered 3 boats & chased them to windward but could not come up with them at 6 PM came on board & shortened sail & staid by the wine to the north latter part of the day light winds from N by E & fine weather at 8 AM were ship to the N by E made sail & commenced mending our blubber & changing out the pots at 9 commenced boiling at 11 AM took ship to the N by E the day ended fine weather
Lat in 4 09 31.13 N Long in 4 Chronometer 49.40 West

20 Remarks on Tuesday June 26th 1849
these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from N by E & smoky weather under all sail steering by the wine having on the watch employed in ships duty at 2 PM finished building out our blackfish oil at sun down shortened sail middle & latter part of the day moderate breeze & fine weather at 5 PM made all sail at 6 took ship & staid by the wine having up SBE N by E watch employed in ships duty at 9 PM saw a topsail schooner off our lee beam steering by the wine to the N by E at 10 PM took ship to the N by E so ended this day Lat in 4 09 31.11 N Long in 4 Chronometer 50.10 West

21 Remarks on Wednesday June 27th 1849
these 24 hours begins a fine breeze from West & fine weather under all sail steering by the wine to the N by E watch employed in ships duty one schooner off our lee beam steering the same at 1 PM saw blackfish going to windward at sun down shortened sail & staid by the wine to the N by E middle & latter part of the day light winds & fine pleasant weather at 5 PM made all sail one schooner off our lee beam & one strong ship off our weather bow steering to the eastward saw commenced breaking out the main hole after water shuggurrie & vinegar & at 7 PM staid EBE the day ended light winds
