

22 Remarks on Thursday June 20th 1849
these 24 hours begins with light winds from the S.W. & fine pleasant weather steering W.B.E. watch employed in stowing off the main hole one whaling schooner in sight & one merchant ship at 2 PM stowed East at 6 PM spoke the schooner - the lock of provisions 75 days out 210 blb of sperm & capt. Hersey came on board at sun down shot him sail calm weather at 9 PM capt. Hersey went on board
Latter part of the day light winds & calm & fine pleasant weather at 5 AM made all sail & stowed by the wind blowing up at 8 PM W.B.E. watch employed in stowing up the main rigging the schooner off our lee beam steering the same course this day
Lat in 4 deg 30.44 N Long in 4 chronometer 50.11 West

23 Remarks on Friday June 29th 1849
these 24 hours begins with light winds from the S.W. & fine weather steering W.B.E. watch employed in fitting up the back block & stows the schooner off our lee beam steering the same at sun down shot him sail & stowed by the wind to the N.W. & latter part of the day light winds & fine weather at 5 AM made sail at 8 PM stowed at 8 PM saw grasshopper steam for then took them to be sperm whales was stowed & at 8 the schooner steering to the North watch employed in ships duty the day more the same
Lat in 4 deg 31.09 N Long in 4 chronometer 50.20 West

24 Remarks on Saturday June 30th 1849
these 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from the westward & fine weather some rain squalls round steering E. & W. watch employed in fitting up the main top gallant backstays & shrouds & setting over our potatoes at 1 PM the schooner went out of sight to the South at 2 PM was stowed W.B.E. at sun down shortened sail & stowed by the wind to the N.W. latter part of the day fine breeze from S.W. & fine weather at 5 AM made all sail saw 3 whaling vessels at 8 PM Tuckers ship to the S.E. watch employed in ships duty at midday on lower deck & picked up a cork so ends this day
Lat in 4 deg 31.24 N Long in 4 chronometer 49.55 West

25 Remarks on Sunday July 1st 1849
these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from S.W. & passing clouds steering E. & W. watch employed in ships duty one sail in sight at 2 PM stowed East at 6 PM the barque Providence spoke us 30 blb with seals came on board at 9 AM went on board & was boated stowed to the westward at 5 AM made all sail & was stowed at 8 PM by the wind with 5 sails at 10 AM stowed North at midday stowed at 8 so ends this day 2 sails in sight
Lat in 4 deg 31.50 N Long in 4 chronometer 50.00 West

26 Remarks on Monday July 2d 1849
these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the S.W. & passing clouds steering W.B.E. at 2 PM nothing in sight at sun down shortened sail & stowed by the wind to the N.W. at 8 AM was ship to the westward at 8 made sail at 8 stowed W.B.E. watch employed in ships duty at 10 PM stowed and broke out after weather at midday on stowed & ends so ends this day Lat in 4 deg 32.43 N Long in 4 chronometer 49.33 West

27 Remarks on Tuesday July 3d 1849
these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the S.W. & fine weather steering E. & W. watch employed in ships duty at 11 PM saw a strong sail of our weather beam at sun down shortened sail & stowed by the wind to the N.W. & latter part of the day moderate breeze & fine weather at 5 AM made sail & stowed W.B.E. watch employed in ships duty at 10 PM stowed at 8 AM at midday on stowed ends so ends this day nothing in sight Lat in 4 deg 33.21 N Long in 4 chronometer 49.18 West

28 Remarks on Wednesday July 4th 1849
these 24 hours begins with light winds from the S.W. & fine pleasant weather steering W.B.E. watch employed in ships duty at 10 PM saw a small school of small blackfish at sun down shortened sail & stowed by the wind broad up and latter part of the day fresh breeze from E. & S.E. & fair weather at 8 AM made sail & stowed by the wind to the N.W. watch employed in ships duty at 11 AM saw a strong sail off our weather beam the day more fine weather
Lat in 4 deg 34.33 N Long in 4 chronometer 49.00 West

29 Remarks on Thursday July 5th 1849
these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from E. & S.E. & fine weather steering by the wind to the N.W. watch employed in ships duty one strong sail in sight off our weather beam at sun down shortened sail & stowed by the wind to the N.W. & latter part of the day light winds from E. & S.E. & fine weather at 5 AM made all sail at 8 PM Tuckers ship to the S.E. watch employed in ships duty saw several pieces of squid the day more fine weather Lat in 4 deg 35.08 N Long in 4 chronometer 48.52 West

30 Remarks on Friday July 6th 1849
these 24 hours begins with light winds from E. & S.E. & fine pleasant weather steering by the wind to the S.E. watch employed in ships duty at sun down shortened sail latter part of the day fresh breeze from W. & S.W. at 4 AM came on board & went at 6 AM fine weather made all sail & Tuckers ship to the North watch employed in washing there close the day more fair weather at midday Tuckers ship to the N.E. Lat in 4 deg 35.14 N Long in 4 chronometer 48.32 West
