

Remarks on Saturday July 7th 1849

Three 24 hours begins with a fresh breeze from the E & fair weather steering by the wind to the SE watch employed in washing there close at sun down shortened sail middle & latter part of the day light breeze & fine pleasant weather at 5 PM made sail & steered by the wind to the SE watch employed in ships duty the day ended the same

Lat in 4 09 34.28 longitude in 4 chronometer 47.50 West

32 Remarks on Sunday July 8th 1849

Three 24 hours begins with light air & wind from the E & fine pleasant weather steering by the wind to the SE watch employed in ships duty at sun down shortened sail latter part of the day light breeze & fine weather at 5 PM made sail at midnoon calm so ended the day

Lat in 4 09 34.09 longitude in 4 chronometer 47.25 West

33 Remarks on Monday July 9th 1849

Three 24 hours begins with calm weather & pleasant weather at 3 PM the wind began from the East steam started by the wind at sun down shortened sail & wore ship to the SE middle & latter part of the day light breeze & fine weather at 5 PM made sail & tacked ship to the North commenced backing out the hole after water flown & dried apples saw on shore sail off our weather bow at 9 went out of sight to the North at 11 AM were finished steering off at midnoon tacked ship to the SE

34 Remarks on Tuesday July 10th 1849

Three 24 hours begins with light breeze from the E & fine pleasant weather steering by the wind to the SE watch employed in ships duty at sun down shortened sail middle & latter part of the day fresh breeze & fine weather at 5 PM wore ship to the SE made sail & tacked ship to the SE duty the day ended with a fine breeze at midnoon tacked ship to the SE

Lat in 4 09 34.27 longitude in 4 chronometer 47.05 West

35 Remarks on Wednesday July 11th 1849

Three 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the E & fine weather steering by the wind to the SE while rating down. Bill shows & mastie got to fighting about three o'clock the masts the latter then a cold thin mist & rain then a heavy fog & more which each other with a piece of warning until they were satisfied on the lower decks at 3 PM saw a strong sail off our bow at 5 PM were exchanged signals with her she proved to be English barque at sun down were shortened sail middle & latter part of the day moderate breeze & fine weather at 5 PM made sail at 8 tacked ship & hoisted up from the SE to the SE watch employed in duty the day ended with 2 small squalls of wind & rain the day ended fine weather

Lat in 4 09 33.51 longitude in 4 chronometer 48.27 West

35 Remarks on Thursday July 12th 1849

Three 24 hours begins with light breeze from East E & B & fine weather under all sail steering by the wind to the SE watch employed in ships duty at sun down shortened sail middle & latter part of the day light breeze & fine pleasant weather at 5 PM made sail & steered by the wind to the SE watch employed in ships duty the wind hauled to the South at midnoon steam started so ended the day

Lat in 4 09 34.30 longitude in 4 chronometer 48.07 West

Remarks on Friday July 13th 1849

Three 24 hours begins with light breeze from the South & fine pleasant weather steering by the wind to the SE watch employed in ships duty at 1 PM were put out stress on the works board for it to run on wheels at sun down shortened sail & steered by the wind to the North

Latter part of the day fine breeze from the E & fine weather at 5 PM made sail at 8 PM steered by the wind to the SE watch employed in washing there close at midnoon steam started so ended the day

Lat in 4 09 35.02 longitude in 4 chronometer 48.22 to 48.37 West

36 Remarks on Saturday July 14th 1849

Three 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the N & fine weather steering by the wind to the SE watch employed in washing there close at sun down shortened sail & steered by the wind to the SE latter part of the day fine breeze & fine weather at 5 PM made sail at 8 PM steered by the wind to the SE watch employed in ships duty one strong ship steering to the SE at 8 PM a school of porpoises came under the bows but did not get past the day ended fine weather steam started

Lat in 4 09 35.51 longitude in 4 chronometer 48.00 West

39 Remarks on Sunday July 15th 1849

Three 24 hours begins with light breeze from west & fine weather watch employed in ships duty steering by the wind to the SE at 2 PM steam started at sun down shortened sail & steered by the wind to the SE

Latter part of the day light breeze from the N & fine pleasant weather at 5 PM made sail at 8 PM tacked ship to the westward at 8 PM a large ship hove in sight but could not get past on board & steered by the wind to the westward at 11 a large ship hove in sight to the westward of us steering to the SE at midnoon were tacked ship to the SE so ended the day
