squalls of rain at 5 PM we were ship to the S.W. & made sail at 6
saw gromphous & black fish water employed in ships duty
the day ends with fine weather nothing in sight

111 Remarks on Tuesday July 17th 1849
these 24 hours begin with a fine breeze from S.W. & fine weather
under all sail steering by the wind to S.W. at 1 PM we saw
a strong sail bearing N.W. & steering to the eastward we took
her to be a whale boat & kept off for her at 2 PM we steered by
the wind to the S.W. & took her to be the barque barceloz
at 3 PM we saw a large whale spouting 4 points of our
weather bow 4 miles distant we tracked ship at 4 PM past 3 PM
we lowered 3 boats & got fast to the waist & killed her
to the larboard boat at 7 PM we got him fluked a long cut
& shot him & set the watch & commenced breaking out
getting ready for cutting in the whale at 11 PM called all hands
& commenced cutting fine weather at 5 PM the governor
happily spoke us he steered off to the S.W. at 11 PM we got the
head cut off the day ends fine weather

one strong merchant brig passed us steering to the S.W. at 9 PM we
got through cutting in our whale & set the watch & began to clear
up for boiling at 1 PM much a fire & commenced boiling & we
Latter part of the day light winds & fine pleasant weather at 5 AM
saw a strong sail off our larboard at 7 PM we saw two sperm
whales bearing S.E. from us 3 miles & going S.W. called all hands
& killed the lines & were ship & headed N.W. & made all sail
the wind died away at 11 the whale went out sight at 9 we saw
several whales more to windward & going S.W. all hands
employed boiling & cutting up junk at midnight finished
cutting junk so ends this day fine weather

115 Remarks on Saturday July 21st 1849
these 24 hours begin with light breeze from E. & E. & calm heading
to the S.E. by the wind at 1 PM made sail boiling at 5 PM finished
boiling & washed off decks middle & Latter part of the day calm
weather & a smooth sea & pleasant weather at 5 PM called
all hands & commenced breaking out the larboard side
of the ship foreward to stern down our oil the day ends calm

116 Remarks on Sunday July 22nd 1849
these 24 hours begin with calm weather & smooth sea & pleasant
weather all hands employed in stowing down oil at sun down
finished stowing off the larboard side foreward & got down
35 bbls & 19 gallons at 8 PM a light breeze sprang up from
