

40 Remarks on Survey July 24th 1849

these 24 hours began with a fine breeze from SE & fine weather stirring by the wind to the E & SE all hands employ'd in stowing down oil & stowing of the hole on stang ship off our lee beam stowing the same as we are at sun down we get all the oil down & finished stowing off the hole & shortened sail latter part of the day fine breeze at 5 & 6 M made all sail & began to gy off the ship inside at 7 finished & tacked ship & biered PM B M by the wind watch employ'd in overhauling there are our compasses the every ones with a fine breeze let in by 30-02 & long in a chronometer 47-40 West

Remarks on Wednesday July 25th 1849

there 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from S E & fair weather upon
all sail steering by the wind hancing S by E by N & M watch empty
in making three close at sun down tacks ship to the eastward & shortened
sail latter part of the day moderate breeze at 5 at M wore ship to the N by E
& made all sail one strong sail in sight at 6 at M the wind halled to the
south tacked ship & headed up E N E & N E steering by the wind watch
empty in ships duty sent down the cutting jordan's & shortened them
& other various kinds of work on board some hoping rain & squalls
the day over fine weather.

the 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the NE & fine weather
in the afternoon sail steering SE watch employed in ships duty fitting up entering
gear & other various kinds of work on board one strong sail off our lee
quarter stowing to the NE at 3 PM saw spouts to the ship for them they
proved to be 3 compasses at 4 tacked to the NE at sun down shortened
sail latter part of the day strong breeze from the westward viz. 2 &
squally by shifts at 5 PM made all necessary sail & stowed south
watch employed in ships duty the day ended more fair

Set in 4 of 37.24 c/h in 4 barometer 46.15 Wad

51 Remarks on Friday July 27th 1849

three 24 hours beyond with fresh breeze from the westward & rugg'd steering south watch employed in ships duty at 3 PM steered by the wind to the S.W. at sun down shot time sail latter part of the day strong breeze & flying squalls & rugg'd at 5 PM made sail steering by the wind to south watch employed in ships duty the day ended the same Let in by 04 38.33 & long in by chronometer 46.06 W.L.A.

There 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from West to NW & rugg'd sea on
 under all masting sail steering by the wind to the south west & employed

 latter part of the day fresh breeze & rugg'd & furious squalls of winter &
 rain at 8 AM wore ship & headed in & watch employ'd on board
 the day incl more moderate

Here 24 hours lying with moderate winds from S.W. & cloudy weather at 1 P.M. stern east turned the ship out main topmast set main topmast sail at sun down shortened sail & steered by the wind to the S.W. latter part of the day strong breeze from the westward suff. & equally by 10 o'clock employed in ship duty saw one strong bird steering to the NW & the day once fair weather. Left in 9.05 38.00 ex Long in 4 brown mtd 15.53 mtd

Remarks on Pinesey July 31st 1849

these 24 hours began with a strong breeze from W by N & reg. & weather clearing by the wind backing S by E & watch employed in ship's duty at sundown wore ship to the N by E at 3 PM we wore ship to keep clear of a strong barge steering to the N by E at 5 o'clock & rainy at 7 AM more than men did the mast & lower sails too sails watch employed in ship's duty at 8 made all sail steering by the wind backing at 6 by E at 10 AM the barge came close & within 100 yds. in 3 months out 100 lbs. the crew ended with a fine breeze & fair weather took ship to the westward
