in ships duty at 1 PM the wine hauled out & tucked ship
to the W at sun down shortened sail middle & latter part of the
day light wind & fine pleasant weather at 5 & 6 PM made all sail
at 8 tucked ship to the eastward watch employed in ships duty at 11
AM saw one strong sail & had there they were with light waves
Latt in 4 09 35.39 or long in 4 chronometer 47.08 West

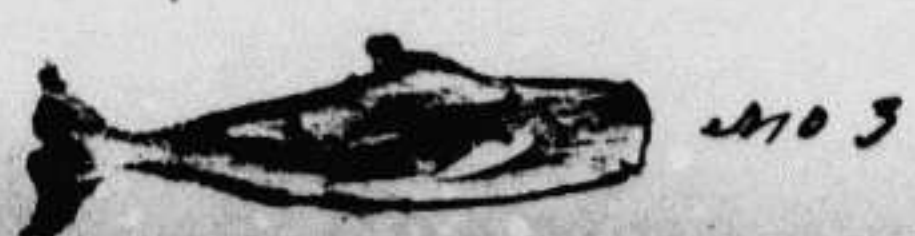

there 24 hours begins with light winds from the north & fine pleasant
weather steering to the eastward by the wine watch employed in ships duty
one strong sail off our lee bow steering to the westward at 3 PM we
stood off for the strong brig at 4 PM it was & the other brig boats lowered
for black fish we got one to the west boat & went on board of the
brig america of Matlapier & left lambert 14 month out 450 66
with lambert came on board of him we took in our fish & pulled
him & sent a letter by him at sun down shortened sail & hauled
to the W at 9 PM lambert went on board & steered the same
latter part of the day fine breeze from the NW fine weather under
all sail steering by the wine & E the america off our lee bow
steering the same saw two strong sails watch employed in working
the day ends the day ends fine weather
Latt in 4 09 35.13 or long in 4 chronometer 48.45 West

there 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the north & fine weather
at 12 PM we steered & left the america in sight at 2 PM end of sight
at 4 PM hauled for black fish got 2 Jackson & went back & pulled them
at sun down shortened sail & went to the NW by the wine latter part of the
day fish breeze & rugg & squally & raining & shells at 5 & 6 PM watch
to the W & E watch employed in minding & boiling out our black fish
the day ends the same fish breeze from the NW
Latt in 4 09 35.12 or long in 4 chronometer 48.20 West

there 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from the NW & some
fading squalls of rain steering by the wine to the W & E watch employed in
boiling black fish at 4 PM the wine hauled round & at 5 PM
boiling & washed off decks middle & latter part of the day light winds
at 5 PM made all sail & steered by the wine hauled 1 PM at 4 PM
5 PM saw a strong whole floating to the NW & going on the sea up
lost to the ship at 7 PM lowered for them the foreward boat got close
on he had his sportings out & went down & the boat went over him
& got him & they went off & then the wine hauled round south
& hauled up at 11 PM came on board & steered for the whole where
we last saw him the day ends fine weather
Latt in 4 09 35.21 or long in 4 chronometer 48.11 West

there 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from the south & fine
weather under all sail steering to the E after the whole where last seen
the wine hauled 1 PM & began to bear on & squall up at 5 PM
at 6 PM we began to shorten sail at sun down steered by the wind
at 9 PM was ship to the south & took in fore top sail squally with rain
with thunder & lightning latter part of the day strong breeze from
the NW & fading squalls steering to the south by the wine watch
employed in ships duty at midnight steered E & B & in the day
Latt in 4 09 35.33 or long in 4 chronometer 48.11 West

there 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from the NW & squally
weather steering to the W & E watch employed in ships duty at sun down steered
by the wind to the south middle part squally weather latter part fresh

backstays saw one ship & began steering to the eastward at 10 PM
we were ship & set up the starboard side at midnight steered E & B
the day ends rugg & Latt in 4 09 35.37 or long in 4 chronometer 48.15 West

were ship to the NW watch employed in ships duty at 11 PM
set the fore & main look in for sail & for the whole last seen on
the day ends the same
