01 Remarks on Sunday August 28th 1849
Three 24 hours begins with light winds from SE & fair weather. Steaming
by the wind to the SE watch employed in ships duty Flores in sight & one
whaling barge to windward. A sick off duty English bill Kettner
saw a fair the latter with the post at sun down obdurate sail latter part of
the day fine bears & passing squalls at 2 PM saw ship to the NW at 5 PM
at 9 PM saw a barge in with the land the day ended with fresh bears
& some squalls at issue in sight

at 1 PM ship the carrying
of women & 20 very out

02 Remarks on Monday August 29th 1849
Three 24 hours begins with fresh bears from East & passing squalls & rain to
the west & the wind at 1 PM took in fly 1/2 h & 1/2 h later at 4 PM
spoke the barge carrying of women & 20 dogs and then I went on
board & got some fresh & came on board again & stood off from the land
at 8 PM in for the land at 5 PM in for the land at 7 PM set the
watch & stood hole watches at 10 PM ship middle & latter part of
the day fine bears & some passing squalls at 8 PM the starboard
boat went on shore after recruits & to land Phillip saw the day
ended lying off & on at 11 PM

03 Remarks on Tuesday August 30th 1849
Three 24 hours begins with fine bears from SE & some passing squalls
of rain lying off & on at Flores recruiting at 3 PM all the potatoes
& onions came a long side in a shore launch carrying sail on
shore & left him in charge of the American consul to be doctor
Tomlin directed by the name John Allen French coast Charles
only & Henry Hetheridge at 5 PM I came on board with guard
menchester & Charles coral & stood off from the land middle &
latter part of the day light winds & calms & passing rain squalls at 8
PM the starboard boat went on shore at Flores the day ended lying off & on
at Flores

Saw a flock of frigate
at 4 PM saw the island
of Loyalty bearing SE by S

04 Remarks on Wednesday August 29th 1849
Three 24 hours begins with light winds & calms & passing showers of rain
lying off & on at Flores island it came at 5 PM boat came on board &
& brought on board 7 wild potatoes in room of the 8 left the
pau got all on board & stood SE with 23 men on board at 8 PM
heard from the westward at sun down shot down some & stood that watch
steering SE latter part of the day fresh bears from the NW to thick
weather & squalls under all weather sail steering from SE to East at 9
PM sighted fogal bearing SE & SP saw a flock of frigate at midday
thick rain & squally weather wind shifted to the north so over the day
Latt

Saw 3 barges on the SE
by 1 PM at 1 PM at 1 PM
anchored at Loyalty

05 Remarks on Thursday August 30th 1849
Three 24 hours begins with thick weather & rain the wind from
north at 1 PM saw ship to the north & double reefed sail in
the port at 3 PM more clear middle & latter part of the day strong bears from
west & a rugged sea on at 7 PM kept off & ran down to the level of fogal
& fine saw 8 ships barge & barge & 3 sailing to anchor at fogal the day ended
the same

in sight of Loyalty

06 Remarks on Friday August 31th 1849
Three 24 hours begins with strong bears from north & east lying back &
forward under the lee of fine several sails in sight at 1 PM took out
the blubber room after water & flour at 11 PM kept off to the SE at 5 PM
steering off the hole at sun down double reefed topsails & stand SE strong
bears & squalls latter part of the day fine bears from north & fair weather
at 4 PM stand SE watch employed in washing there close at 7 PM made
all sail at 8 PM last sight of fine & fire the day ended fair weather
Latt in by 37.3° or long in by chronometer 27. or West

at 10 PM at 11 PM at 11 PM
anchored at Loyalty

07 Remarks on Saturday September 1st 1849
Three 24 hours begins with a fine bear from north & fair weather
under all sail steering SE watch employed in washing there close
at sun down shot down sail & stand SE middle & latter part of the day
fresh bears from north & cloudy weather at 5 PM made sail & stand
SE watch employed in ship duty at 10 PM sent down the foremast
& fitted the top lanes at 11 PM at one point the day ended nothing in
sight Latt in by 38.22 or long in by chronometer 25.18 West

nothing in sight the day
at 10 PM at 11 PM at 11 PM
anchored at Loyalty

08 Remarks on Sunday September 2nd 1849
Three 24 hours begins with fresh bears from north & cloudy weather
steering SE watch employed in ships duty at 2 PM sent up the foremast
at sun down shot down sail & stand by the wind to the Eastward
latter part of the day moderate bears SE & fine weather at 5 PM made
sail & stand SE at 10 PM sent down the foremast at 11 PM the day ended
fine weather Latt in by 35.33 or long in by chronometer 24.113 West

at 10 PM at 11 PM at 11 PM
anchored at Loyalty

09 Remarks on Monday September 3rd 1849
Three 24 hours begins with moderate bears from north & fine weather
steering SE at 1 PM saw white water bearing NW in steam for it at
2 PM at 3 PM saw nothing more of it at sun down shot down sail & stand
by the wind to the SE latter part of the day fresh bears & passing clouds at 5
PM made sail steering by the wind making SE watch employed in
ships duty fitting the new boat for whaling saw one where it passed
the day ended nothing in sight
Latt in by 34.30 or long in by chronometer 23.110 West
