107 Remarks on Friday September 21st 1849 these 24 hours begins with light winds from the north & fine pleasant weather all hands employed in cutting in our whale at sun down got the whale all on board & cutting tackle stowed below were ship to the eastward got supper & set the watch between watch on deck getting ready for boiling head at 9 PM made a fire & commenced boiling milt & latter part of the day light winds & calm & fine pleasant weather all hands employed in cutting blubber & boiling & taking care of oil saw one strong seal so near this day saw black fish & porpoise Let in by 09 32. 20 N long in by chronometer 20.43 West

108 Remarks on Saturday September 22nd 1849 these 24 hours begins with a light breeze from the westward & fine weather all hands employed in boiling & cutting blubber & taking care of oil 2 strong seals in sight at 7 PM the wind began to bear from S W & clouds by shifts latter part of the day strong breeze from S W ruggid & squally by shells & rain at 11 could down at 4 but 11 commenced boiling a gun cleared off main clear but strong breeze & puff weather saw one large to leeward steering to the NW by so near this day Let in by 09 32 23 N long in by chronometer 21.07 West

109 Remarks on Sunday September 23rd 1849 these 24 hours begins with strong breeze from S W & ruggid sea on & passing down steering by the wind to the NW in under double reef main top sail fore sail main spruce & fore top mast stay all hands employed in boiling & taking care of our oil at 4 PM next reefed main top sail equally & bearing on & growing ruggid struck & work of oil in the blubber room at 9 PM equally & rain & lightening to the NW put out the fire at 12 the wind hauled to the NW in a squall were ship to the NW at 3 at 4 PM saw a seal made a fire & commenced boiling the crew once fresh breeze & ruggid & fair weather Let in by 09 32. 20 N long in by chronometer 21.18 West

110 Remarks on Monday September 24th 1849 these 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from NW to SW & ruggid & some heaving squalls of rain steering to the SW by the wind under short sail at 3 PM finished boiling & washed off decks at sun down were ship & hauled up the middle & latter part of the day fresh breeze from NW & fair weather & ruggid at 8 PM commenced breaking out the stow down our oil the day once ruggid & fair weather steering down oil Let in by 09 32. 20 N long in by chronometer 21.00 West

111 Remarks on Tuesday September 25th 1849 these 24 hours begins with strong breeze from NW & fair weather & ruggid sea on heading to the SW by the wind under easy sail all hands employed in stowing down oil at sun down left of work got down 52 barrels at 9 PM hauled up the fore sail & log under double reef main top sail at 5 PM commenced breaking out the hole to finish stowing down our oil started out the iron hoops & too work of towline strong breeze from NW squally & ruggid sea on & bearing on all the time it being so bad we were obliged to strike our oil & work below without stowing it in the ground tar heavy squalls of wind & rain & a head sea on at midnight got through & washed off decks Let in by 09 32. 15 N long in by chronometer 20.25 West

112 Remarks on Wednesday September 26th 1849 these 24 hours begins with strong winds from the north squally by shells & a ruggid sea on at 1 PM steered S E under double reef main top sail & fore sail bound to the Canary islands at sun down fore sail reefed main top sail & luffed to the wind to the Eastward latter part of the day light winds from the north & fine weather at 8 PM made sail & steered S E watch employed in ships duty grinding spades & other various kinds of work on board too seals in sight the day once light winds & fine weather Let in by 09 31. 39 N long in by chronometer 19.12 West

113 Remarks on Thursday September 27th 1849 these 24 hours begins with light winds & fine weather & ruggid sea on steering south watch employed in fitting up the cutting gear spades & C two seals in sight at sun down shortened sail at 7 PM at 12 at night a light breeze blowing up from S W at 4 PM at 8 PM made sail steering by the wind heading from S to S E several seals in sight were hauled out the hole to finish stowing down our oil the day once fine weather all hands employed in stowing off the blubber room Let in by 09 31. 04 N long in by chronometer 19.22 West

114 Remarks on Friday September 28th 1849 these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from S W S W & fair weather steering by the wind to the S E several seals in sight at 2 PM finished stowing off & laid off the ship & washed off sun down shortened sail at 1 at 3 PM were ship to the NW at 5 were ship to the south & made all sail fine breeze from S W to NW & fine weather watch employed in washing three days one big in sight a head steering by the wind to the SW so near this day Let in by 09 30. 10 N long in by chronometer 18.12 West

115 Remarks on Saturday September 29th 1849 these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NW to SW & fair weather under all sail steering by the wind to the S E watch employed in washing three days one big a head steering the same were caught one porpoise at sun down shortened sail latter part of the day light winds from NW & fine weather at 8 PM made sail steering by the wind to the S W the wind hauled in sight bearing south one seal in sight watch employed in ships duty took down bottom bin & other various kinds of work Let in by 09 29. 18 N long in by chronometer 17.50 West
