

165 Remarks on Sunday November 16th 1849

these 24 hours begins with moderate winds from West & cloudy weather & some passing showers of rain during by the wind to the S.W. under short sail all hands employed in boiling & taking care of oil at 12 at night finished boiling large latter part of the day fine breeze from S.W. & passing clouds at daylight commenced cutting up junk & made a fire & began to boil hied saw the 2 powder in the lower at 2 we saw her tacking ship & running under more sail & at 4 for him saw several bargues & kings at 4 past 11 we left to the wind the day ends fine weather all hands employed in boiling

166 Remarks on Monday November 19th 1849

these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from N.E. & passing clouds during by the wind to the N. all hands employed in boiling hied at 3 past 3 PM finished boiling & washed off decks at 4 PM the big on narrow spoke we capt tolder came on board 13 months out then told us sundown shot down sail at 4 capt tolder went on board & ever were ship & headed up here latter part of the day light winds & calms at 8 AM made sail & commenced breaking out the stow down oil several sails in sight rain squalls hanging round all hands employed in stowing down oil so end the day

167 Remarks Tuesday November 20th 1849

these 24 hours begins with light winds all round the compass & calms all hands employed in stowing down oil several sails in sight at 8 PM the barque Susan set her private signal for me to come on board & I went on board & after capt henland was sick 4 months out lean at sun down left off work & shot down sail at 4 past 2 I came on board & stow to the crew by the wind latter part of the day fine breeze & cloudy weather at 6 made all necessary sail & commenced stowing down oil several whole vessels in sight during the day the day ends all hands employed in stowing down oil

168 Remarks on Wednesday November 21st 1849

these 24 hours begins with moderate winds from N.W. & cloudy weather during by the wind to the N.W. breeze easy sail all hands employed in stowing down oil at 11 PM we were ship to the N.E. at 5 began to rain got all the oil down at dark left off work & took in sail on narrow in sight middle & latter part of the day equally & raining by shells at 7 AM made all hands & commenced stowing off the hole at 9 made all sail finished stowing & washed off decks the sails in sight the day ends equally no latitude

169 Remarks on Thursday November 22nd 1849

these 24 hours begins with equally & rainy weather by shells watch employed in washing the lower hulls one spigg one sail in sight at 4 PM we took a squall of wind & rain cloud down to it & were ship to the eastward & shot down sail at 6 AM holes up raining at 7 AM job & spunker watch employed in ships duty fitting up whole gear one sail in sight at 9 was ship to the North past bears from E. & E. at midnoon stars within or close this day

170 Remarks on Friday November 23rd 1849

these 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from E. & E. & passing clouds during by the wind to the N.W. all hands employed in fitting up whole gear & repairing cask at 2 PM stand by the wind to the North one barque off our bow stowing the same at sun down shot down sail & were ship to the N. the 2 powder in the lower she shot down sail & were ship to the N. middle & latter part of the day fine breeze from E. & E. & passing clouds at 5 AM we were ship to the N. & made all sail watch employed in fitting up whole gear & repairing up old shoes several sails in sight at midnoon tacked ship to the N.E.

171 Remarks on Saturday November 24th 1849

these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from E. & E. & fine weather under all sail during by the wind watch employed in ships duty fitting up cutting gear & ships pendents & grinating spears & repairing up old shoes several sails in sight at sun down shot down sail middle & latter part of the day fine breeze & fine weather at 12 were ship to the N.W. at 5 made all sail for barque in sight watch employed in ships duty repairing up the main quarter rail making bungs & repairing up old shoes the day ends fine weather
Lat in 4 deg 15.30 South Long in 4 chronomet. 35.50 West

172 Remarks on Sunday November 25th 1849

these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from more & fine weather under all sail during by the wind to the N.W. watch employed in ships duty making bungs & repairing the main channels & the water repairing old cask one barque to the westward during the day at 4 PM the barque barkeley spoke we capt king came on board 54 months out 216 lbs at sun down shot down sail & were ship to the N.E. at 4 past 9 capt king went on board middle & latter part of the day light winds & calms barkeley off our starboard bow the day ends calm & pleasant weather
