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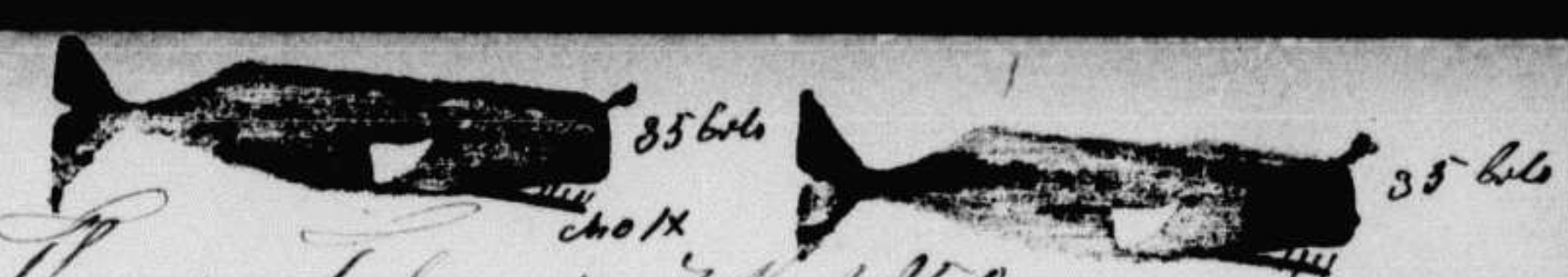

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241 Remarks on Saturday February 27 1850
Three 24 hours begins with a fresh breeze from ESE & passing clouds steering by the wind to the SE under double reef topsails course 95th & 100th watch employed in ship's duty at sun down shot down sail at 11 PM spoke with a brig name unknown bound to Pernambuco at 5 PM made sail at 5 steam 10 knots & at 10 steam 12 knots by the wind to the SE & watch employed in ship's duty at midnight made all sail & tacked ship & hauled out the anchor at 11 PM shot with a long range and new compass to determine

242 Remarks on Sunday February 28 1850
Three 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from ESE & good weather steering by the wind to the SE at 4 PM watch employed in ship's duty at sun down shot down sail & wore ship to the SE & latter part of the day fresh breeze & passing clouds at 5 PM wore ship to the SE & made all necessary sail the day ended the same nothing in sight
Set in by 17.27 South Long in by chronometer 33.14 west

243 Remarks on Monday February 29 1850
Three 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from ESE & passing clouds steering by the wind to the SE at 4 PM at sun down shot down sail & wore ship to the SE & latter part of the day fresh breeze & cloudy weather at 5 PM made sail at 5 steam 10 knots & at 10 steam 12 knots by the wind to the SE the day ended fresh breeze nothing in sight
Set in by 17.27 South Long in by chronometer 33.52 west

244 Remarks on Tuesday February 30 1850
Three 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from ESE & cloudy weather steering by the wind to the SE watch employed in ship's duty at 4 PM saw 2 steam sails to windward one of them a ship at sun down shot down sail at 8 PM one of the steam sails passed near to us latter part of the day fine breeze & cloudy & overcast weather at 5 PM wore ship & hauled in & out E & made sail watch employed in ship's duty put on new main top gallant lift the day ended with a fine breeze Set in by 17.35 South Long in by chronometer 35.10 west

245 Remarks on Wednesday February 31 1850
Three 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from ESE & cloudy overcast weather steering by the wind to the North watch employed in ship's duty at sun down shot down sail & wore ship to the SE latter part of the day fine breeze from ESE & some passing rain squalls at 5 PM wore ship to the North & made sail one steam barque to the leeward steering the same watch employed in ship's duty making clock stroke & other various kinds of work on board the day ended the same
Set in by 18.54 South Long in by chronometer

246 Remarks on Thursday February 7 1850
Three 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from ESE some passing showers & rain by shells steering to the SE by the wind watch employed in ship's duty one steam barque to the leeward steering the same as our own at sun down shot down sail & wore ship to the SE latter part of the day fine breeze & some passing squalls & rain & wind at 5 PM made sail at 5 tacked ship to the North & rized in by 10 knots at 8 PM at 8 PM rain & a school of whales a head going NW at 9 PM wore 3 boats & got one to the starboard bow & one to the starboard bow the day ended all hands employed in getting the whale a long side
Set in by 18.20 South Long in by 37.02 west

247 Remarks on Friday February 8 1850
Three 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from ESE & fair weather all hands employed in getting the whale to the ship at 3 PM commenced cutting in our whale at 4 PM got one of them on board & at the watch shot watches from 12 to 4 we had several showers of rain at 5 PM called all hands & commenced cutting in our whale fine weather saw one steam sail to windward steering to the North at midnight got the whale all on board so ended this day
Set in by 18.35 South Long in by chronometer 37.21 west

248 Remarks on Saturday February 9 1850
Three 24 hours begins with light winds from East & fine weather all hands employed in clearing a way our whale heads at 5 PM got both reses hauled & put forth cut up made a fine & commenced boiling broil heading to the North under double reef main top sail & fore sail at 5 PM set the watch middle latter part of the day light winds & fine weather all hands employed in cutting up blubber & boiling at 4 PM at 11 PM spoke with a steam barque bound to Newcastle up the day ended light winds & pleasant weather
Set in by 16.19 South Long in by chronometer 37.39 west

249 Remarks on Sunday February 10 1850
Three 24 hours begins with light breeze from East & fine pleasant weather heading to the SE & under short sail all hands employed in cutting up blubber & boiling it out two sails in sight at 9 PM wore ship to the SE & made sail latter part of the day light winds & fine weather all hands employed in boiling saw one schooner & one brig at 10 PM spoke with a steam barque bound to Newcastle up the day ended fine weather
Set in by 18.11 South Long in by chronometer 37.45 west
