the 24 hours begins with light air of wind from the South & fine
smooth weather during the watch employed in fitting black strops
& fine at 2 calm weather at 5 PM the wind bore from the S.E. & the
watch at sun down reefed topsails & then shot watches through the
night during the watch with a fine breeze & fine weather at 8 at m
the watch employed in ships duty took out the blubber room
& got out the cask of sails but did not on land the topsails so on the way
Left in 4 of 27.39 at long in 4 chronometer 77.13 west

310 Remarks on Thursday April 11th 1850
the 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the South & fine weather
during the watch employed in ships duty fitting black strops & fine &
strops on land the main topgallant sail & then the old one at 4 put
11 PM lowered for black strops & got on small one to the larboard boat
& one very large for the starboard boat at sun down
shot down sail & lay with the fore topsail aloft & the
latter end middle & latter part of the day fine breeze from the N. & the
at 5 at m were ship to the westward & made all sail &
stood by the wind watch employed in ships duty hoisted our
blubber & commenced boiling it at 11 at m lowered &
wrought a large long head the at m motion stand
at 11 so ends this day fine weather

blackfish blubber & making new boat grips at 4 put 5 saw a
stray sail at sun down shot down sail & stood by the wind to the
E. & at 11 PM a thinner cloud rose up from the North & a plenty
of lightning at 12 the wind bore to the N.E. & did a way again
& bore up from the N. at 3 at m were ship to the westward at
5 at m made sail at 7 stood over the wire five strops sails at 10
stood at the watch employed in ships duty shifted our topsails & hoisted
the old one forward the day ends fine weather nothing in sight
Left in 4 of 29.00 at long in 4 chronometer 76.00 west

312 Remarks on Saturday April 13th 1850
the 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the S.W. & smooth weather
during the watch employed in ships duty at 8 PM we took a
squall from the N.E. & the watch at 10 at m the wind
bore up from the N.E. & a way again middle part squally weather & then
with lightning & some rain latter part fresh breeze from the N.E.
& fine weather at 5 at m made some sail during the watch to
the N.E. watch employed in ships duty at 11 set fifth spar
& hoisted the day ends fine weather but no sight of sea
Left in 4 of 29.33 at long in 4 chronometer 77.50 west

313 Remarks on Sunday April 14th 1850
the 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from the N.E. & fine weather
overhead but rough sea during the watch employed
in ships duty making boat grips & other various kinds of work on
board saw two stray sails at sun down shot down sail middle &
latter part of the day strong breeze from the N.E. & rough sea on
the weather at 2 at m were ship to the N.W. at 5 at m the fore
topsail double reefed the day ends more moderate but rough sea on
Left in 4 of 29.50 at long in 4 chronometer 77.12 west

& a rough sea on during the watch employed in ships duty
at 5 at m saw a large long head the at m motion stand
