& rain from the North attended with thunder & lightning but

down shortened sail at same time she spoke the big sea bird bound
to west Indies at dusk i came on board & stuns to the ESE &

ESE & ruff weather at 5 a.m. were ship to the NW by & made all
mainsail sail at 11 saw a barque steering to the NW the day ended

took the two lastward boats up on upper masts middle & latter
part of the day strong breeze from the South ruff sea on & thick
weather steering by the wind heading ESE under shot sail watch
employed in fitting up the signals & so ended the day

at 9 AM a strong breeze

a.m. set the fore sail saw a whaling schooner steering East
at 8 began to squall & rain took in fore sail & fore top sail
at 11 past 10 more clear set them again & stuns ESE the day ended
