Three 24 hours begins with light winds from the SE & fine weather
steering by the wind to the NW & watch empty in ship's duty one
schooner in sight steering to the NW looking out for whales at 7
PM the schooner N. Williams young of previous tour abate us
2 months out 20 hrs capt young came on board & shot him at
8 went on board & saw steam by the wind to the NW & latter part
of the day light winds & fine weather 3 sailing vessels in sight steering
by the wind to the NW & one schooner & full riged brig off our lee quarter
& one schooner off our weather quarter the day ends the same fine weather
Set in by 37.11.45 at long in by chronometer 111.11 west

375 Remarks on Saturday June 15th 1850
Three 24 hours begins with light winds from the SE & fine weather
steering by the wind heading SE & SE & 3 sailing vessels in sight
one full riged brig & schooner off our lee quarter & one schooner off our
weather quarter all steering by the wind to the NW at 5 PM the
schooner Walter ex-vice capt nicholson of previous tour abate us 2 months
out 125 hrs capt nicholson came on board & saw steam and took in
the light sails at 9 capt nicholson went on board & steered to the South
& we stand to the NW & middle & latter part of the day fine weather
at 8 AM made all sail watch empty in ship's duty one sailing
schooner in sight & two merchant brigs saw a large school of
porpoise & caught one the day ends fine weather
Set in by 37.05.51 at long in by chronometer 111.05 west

376 Remarks on Sunday June 16th 1850
Three 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from SE & fine weather
steering by the wind to the NW & watch empty in ship's duty about
the rising one sailing schooner in sight the schooner Williams & one merchant
brig & one more strong sail to windward middle & latter part of the
day light winds & fine weather at 5 PM four merchant vessels
in sight steering to the NW & saw grampuses & porpoise several the day
Set in by 37.01.21 at long in by chronometer 113.00 west

377 Remarks on Monday June 17th 1850
Three 24 hours begins with light winds from SE & fine weather
steering by the wind heading E & SE four strong sails in sight merchant
men steering to the NW & middle & latter part of the day light winds
from South & fine weather steering by the wind heading up E & SE & SE
watch empty in clearing the deck off the iron work & painting it
in longues & ships in sight steering to the Eastward at 2 PM 11 AM
saw two brigs bearing SE & SE & 2000 of for them 1.30 minutes saw
nothing more of them steam & SE the day ends with a fine breeze
Set in by 37.46.45 at long in by chronometer 111.10 west

378 Remarks on Tuesday June 18th 1850
Three 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the South & fine weather
steering by the wind heading E & SE & SE watch empty in clearing
the rest of the iron work & painting it 11 strong sails in sight and made
a new tarpaulin for the after hatch at 5 PM we had a rain shower
middle & latter part of the day fine breeze from the SE & fine weather
steering SE & SE several sails in sight saw one school of porpoise
the day ends with winds from SE & fine weather
Set in by 37.46.45 at long in by chronometer 111.20 west

379 Remarks on Wednesday June 19th 1850
Three 24 hours begins with light winds from SE & fine weather steering
SE & SE 3 merchant vessels in sight at 8 PM we picked up a box middle
latter part of the day light winds from NW & fine smooth & pleasant
weather steering East at 6 AM we killed 2 Sub. on board the yacht tobacco
& middleside it saw some porpoise the day ends light winds
Set in by 37.04.01 at long in by chronometer 110.10 west

380 Remarks on Thursday June 20th 1850
Three 24 hours begins with light winds from NW & fine weather
steering East watch empty in ship's duty but the yacht tobacco
& other various kinds of work on board at 4 PM saw porpoise middle
& latter part of the day light breeze from the NW & fine weather
at 8 AM on board the fly jell & middleside it & 4 but it a yan
two strong sails in sight the day ends fine weather
Set in by 37.40.40 at long in by chronometer 110.40 west

381 Remarks on Friday June 21st 1850
Three 24 hours begins with light breeze from NW & fine weather
steering East watch empty in ship's duty set up main to mast
rising at 2 PM we had a rain shower latter part of the day
light breeze & some squalls passing rounder watch empty in
ship's duty saw porpoise the day ends light winds
Set in by 37.05.05 at long in by chronometer 110.03 west

382 Remarks on Saturday June 22nd 1850
Three 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from the SE & fine
weather & a smooth sea steering East watch empty in ship's duty fine
the for trap band but two bins of wood up & down the mast on the
after part to had the bins down saw a plenty of porpoise & struck
one & drew out the iron out middle & latter part of the day light winds &
fine weather at 8 PM we fired the main truss full pins of wood
four of the top of it saw grampuses & porpoise the day ends fine
weather
