

83 Remarks on Sun day June 23d 1850

Three 24 hours begins with light winds from the westward & fine weather steering E by S saw porpoise midle & latter part of the day light winds & fine weather at 2 PM lowered one boat after. killed one not yet. A just came on board saw a plenty of porpoise today once fine weather. Lett in by 38.51 & long in by chronometer 32.00 east

84 Remarks on Monday June 24th 1850

Three 24 hours begins with light winds from NW & fine weather steering E by S at 1 PM set all sail at 2 PM saw the island of Flores bearing E by E 38 50 miles distance at sun down took in the light sails & steam. E by E midle & latter part of the day light breeze from the N by E fine weather at 4 PM steam E at 8 on board the fore sail & repaired it & sent it a gap plenty of porpoise in sight the day ends fine pleasant weather. Lett in by 38.11 & long in by chronometer 30.57 west

85 Remarks on Tuesday June 25th 1850

Three 24 hours begins with light breeze from the SE & fine weather steering SE at 2 PM saw a school of large whales bearing SE by E & going quick to leeward for them & got one to the west boat & took him a long side & sent the two barbed boats off after the whale could not come up with them came on board shot him with a 12 lb gun & got up the cutting tools ready for cutting got supper & set the watch at 11 PM called all hands & commenced cutting in our whale light breeze & fine smooth weather the day ends the same. Lett in by 38.37 & long in by chronometer 30.39 west

86 Remarks on Wednesday June 26th 1850

Three 24 hours begins with light breeze from the NW & fine weather all hands employed in cutting in our whale at 4 PM got him all on board & got down the tackle & went to boiling & cutting fresh at the fore sail & hauled to the NW by 5 PM saw a steamer steering to the Eastward nearly calm at 2 PM the wind blew up from SE at 4 PM began to rain fast on calico cover thick all round at 6 PM made a fire & began to boil & cut blubber dried by weather the wind blew round to the NW steering by the wind to the NW & under short sail the day ends thick weather. no Lett & no long

87 Remarks on Thursday June 27th 1850

Three 24 hours begins with cloudy weather the wind from NW & heading to the NW & under short sail all hands employed in boiling & mincing blubber at 1 PM got all the blubber cut in horse pieces saw one big steamer to the SE at sun down was ship & hauled E by E midle & latter part of the day fine weather at 5 PM made all sail & steam East saw one big steamer to the westward employed in boiling the day ends fine weather bearing E by S 3 the wind Lett in by 38.53 & long in by chronometer 29.57 west

88 Remarks on Friday June 28th 1850

Three 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the E by E to East & fine weather under all sail steering by the wind bearing from SE to S by E all hands employed in boiling out our whale at 1 PM saw the island of Flores bearing E by E 38 50 miles distance at 4 PM finished boiling & washed off decks at 3 PM saw one at sun down shot him with a 12 lb gun ship to the NW & latter part of the day fine breeze from SE to E at 2 PM several flying squalls at 4 PM made all sail & commenced working our oil at 6 PM took ship to the SE saw jumps & porpoise the day ends fine weather. Lett in by 38.10 east

89 Remarks on Saturday June 29th 1850

Three 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the E & fine weather under all sail in working oil at 2 PM took ship to the NW bearing E by E 25 miles distance at 4 PM at 3 PM got all the catch worked ready to store down below at sun down shot him with a 12 lb gun & latter part of the day light breeze from E by S & fine weather at 4 PM made sail & commenced breaking out the store down oil the day ends all hands employed in storing down oil & working off our meat. Lett in by 39.00 & long in by chronometer 29.57 west

90 Remarks on Sunday June 30th 1850

Three 24 hours begins with light breeze from E by S & fine weather steering by the wind to the NW & all hands employed in storing down oil & working off our meat saw 2 blunt nose grampasses at 4 PM got through & steering & washed off decks at sun down took in sail calm midle & latter part of the day calm weather & pleasant fog at 4 PM in sight at 10 PM a light breeze sprung up from the NW steam SE the day ends light breeze Lett in by 39.10 & long in by chronometer 29.10 west

91 Remarks on Monday July 1st 1850

Three 24 hours begins with faint breeze from the SE fine pleasant weather steering SE by E fogal in sight bearing SE by E washed up at sun down shot him with a 12 lb gun for the first time at 4 PM heading to the NW midle & latter part of the day fine breeze from the NW & fine weather at 11 PM made sail & steam SE in towards the land saw one whaling brig at 12 PM watch employed in ship duty started on each envelope & filled it with salt water the day ends fine weather 2 islands in sight

92 Remarks on Tuesday July 2d 1850

Three 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from the westward & fine weather steering down for the George bound to the river watches employed in ship duty repairing cutting gear & grinding blades one whaling brig in sight at 5 PM spoke the big pioneer weeks of green port 5 months out 70 lbs & westward at 6 PM came on board & started through between St George & granison midle & latter part of the day fine weather steering for the river the day ends the same
