

20 Remarks on Wednesday August 7th 1850

the 24 hours begins with light breeze from NW & fine pleasant smooth weather. 3 boats off port to a sperm whale at 4 past 2 PM got the whole flock a long side at 4 past 3 commenced cutting on the head at sun down got the head cut off & some of the body on deck left off work & got supper & set the watch at 8 PM middle part of the day calm weather at 3 AM a light breeze sprang up from NW at 4 AM all hands & boat out the blubber room & commenced cutting in the whales livery at 4 past 11 got the whole all on board made sail & steamed by the wind heading South, made a fire & commenced boiling hove the day ends fine weather.

Left in 1/2 of 34.04 or long in 1/2 chronometer 55.35 west

29 Remarks on Thursday August 8th 1850

the 24 hours begins with light breeze from NW & fine weather steering by the wind to the South all hands employed in cutting up junk & boiling hove same one strong sail at 8 PM took ship & hove at 11 PM to NW light breeze latter part of the day fine breeze from NW & fine weather at 8 AM made sail heading up the NW all hands employed in boiling & cutting up blubber same one in light breeze steering by the wind the day ends with a fine breeze & fine weather.

Left in 1/2 of 33.55 or long in 1/2 chronometer 56.05 west

30 Remarks on Friday August 9th 1850

the 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NW & fine weather steering by the wind to the NW all hands employed in boiling & taking care of oil at 4 past 5 PM took in the light sails & double reefed the topsails much & latter part of the day fresh breeze from NW & rough sea on steering by the wind heading NW & NW at 11 AM finished boiling out our whale & washed & decked the day ends strong breeze & equally & still.

Left in 1/2 of 34.04 or long in 1/2 chronometer 57.30 west

1 Remarks on Saturday August 10th 1850

the 24 hours begins with strong breeze from NW & rough & equally steering by the wind to the westward & NW all hands employed in steaming our oil below at 4 PM got it all below but one cask & sent down the royal yards & spun main yard & rigger sea on saw one strong sail at 7 PM set the watch & stowed hole watches at 11 PM it lightning all round latter part of the day more moderate the wind heading round to the westward at 8 AM hove up our old boat at 10 made all sail heading up creek to the day ends fine weather.

Left in 1/2 of 34.30 or long in 1/2 chronometer 58.30 west

32 Remarks on Sunday August 11th 1850

the 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NW & fine weather under all sail steering by the wind heading up from over to the NW watch employed in ships duty various kinds of work on board at 8 PM took ship to the NW at 9 AM at 10 the wind headed from NW to the NW & latter part of the day fresh breeze by shifts from NW to the NW steering by the wind to the NW to save several strong sails steering to the Eastward the day ends with a fresh breeze & fair weather.

Left in 1/2 of 35.20 or long in 1/2 chronometer 59.42 west

33 Remarks on Monday August 12th 1850

the 24 hours begins with a fresh breeze by shifts from NW to the NW steering to the NW by the wind one sail in sight steering to the Eastward at 8 PM took ship to the NW at 11 AM took ship & headed up NW at 11 AM the wind headed to the NW took ship to the NW to the wind headed round to the NW steamed West at 8 AM commenced hoisting up our oil to work saw one whaling barque steering to the westward the day ends with a fine breeze from the NW & fine weather steering down the NW

Left in 1/2 of 34.52 or long in 1/2 chronometer 61.00 west

34 Remarks on Tuesday August 13th 1850

the 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the NW & fine weather under all sail steering west one whaling barque in sight steering to the same all hands employed in steaming down the NW at 8 PM finished steaming got down 20 bbls much & latter part of the day moderate breeze from NW & fine weather steering NW & NW watch employed in ships duty painting the iron work & other various kinds of work on strong whaling barque off our starboard quarter steering NW the day ends fine pleasant weather.

Left in 1/2 of 34.58 or long in 1/2 chronometer 63.00 west

35 Remarks on Wednesday August 14th 1850

the 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from NW & fine weather steering NW & one strong whaling barque off our starboard quarter steering the same watch employed in blacking the iron work & other various kinds of work on board at 1 PM saw a strong sail at 4 PM many calm at 12 the wind headed from NW & NW to the NW & latter part of the day fresh breeze from NW & fine weather watch employed in changing the rollers & treyworks the strong whaling barque off our bow the day ends fresh breeze took in for 2 yellowboils

Left in 1/2 of 35.17 or long in 1/2 chronometer 65.00 west
