This day commences with a fine East wind. Harbor watch on shore. Middle part the same. At 6 A. M. all hands aboard. At 7 A. M. Harbor watch went on liberty. Next employed in ship's duty. Latter part the same. Ends this day.

This day commences with a fine East wind. Harbor watch on shore. Next employed in ship's duty. Middle part the same. At 6 A. M. Harbor watch came aboard and at 7 A. M. Harbor watch went on liberty. Latter part the same. Ends this day.

Friday March 6th

This day commences with a fine East wind with clear weather. Laying to an anchor. Harbor watch on shore. Next employed in ship's duty. At 6 A. M. Harbor watch came aboard. Latter part took in ship's stores. Men employed in stowing provisions. Ends this day.

Saturday March 7th

This day commences with a fine breeze from East, with clear weather. Ship laying to an anchor. Men employed in stowing provisions. Middle and latter part squally. Men employed in ship's duty. Ends this day.

Sunday March 8th

This day commences with a light breeze from South with rainy weather. At about 2 P. M. left our anchorage at Barbados. At Trinidad the land 3 miles off. Middle part variable winds. Latter part wind from S. E. with clear weather. Ship heading North. Ends this day.

This day commences with variable wind with squally weather. Ship laying off and on the Island of Dominica. Captain leaves the Harbor at 1 P. M. to go to Roseau to get a permit to go in and anchor. Middle part laying off and on. Came to an anchor at 7 A. M. in 7 fathoms of water. Men employed in ship's duty. Ends this day.

Thursday March 12th

This day commences with a light breeze from S. E. with clear weather. Ship laying to an anchor. Men employed in getting water. Middle and latter part the same. Ends this day.
