middle and latter part variable winds with
squally of rain so ends the day

This day commences with squally weather ship
upon different tacks middle part the same
latter part fine breeze from W ship
heading South saw 3 whalers to star

part light winds and calm so ends the day

different tacks middle part the same
saw a number of sails at 11 A.M. I
saw a large school of 13 fin whale
going to the East did not toward the
Boats so ends the day

from E by E with clear weather ship
upon different tacks middle part the
same latter part thick rainy weather
saw 1 sail so ends the day
